13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Public Safety**

17 (a) The Commission has the following powers and duties:

18 (16) to require, for entrance-level police training and, as determined by the
19 Commission, for in-service level training conducted by the State and each county and
20 municipal police training school, that the curriculum and minimum courses of study
21 include, consistent with established law enforcement standards and federal and State
22 constitutional provisions:
