A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Libraries – State Library Resource Center – Funding**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the calculation of certain funding for the State Library
4 Resource Center for certain fiscal years; and generally relating to the State Library
5 Resource Center.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Education**

21 Library Resource Center.

5 (c) (1) Subject to subsection (g) of this section, each year each participating
6 regional resource center shall receive a minimum amount of funding for each resident of
7 the area served, to be used for operating and capital expenses.
