4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Oversight Committee on Quality of  
5 Care in Nursing Homes and Assisted Living Facilities; and generally relating to the  
6 Oversight Committee on Quality of Care in Nursing Homes and Assisted Living  
7 Facilities.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24 nursing home or have a family member living in an assisted living facility or a nursing
