A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Law – Interference With Access to or Egress From a Religious**
3 **Facility – Prohibition**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person, acting alone or with others, from preventing
5 another from entering or exiting a religious facility; and generally relating to access
6 to or egress from religious facilities.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Criminal Law**

20 10–204.

21 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
22 (2) (i) “Medical facility” means:

8 (b) (1) This section does not apply to:

9 (i) the chief executive officer of the medical facility;

10 (ii) a designee of the chief executive officer of the medical facility;

11 (iii) an agent of the medical facility; or

12 (iv) a law enforcement officer.

13 (2) This section does not prohibit:

14 (i) speech; or

15 (ii) picketing in connection with a labor dispute as defined in §
16 4-301 of the Labor and Employment Article.

17 (c) A person may not intentionally act, alone or with others, to prevent another
18 from entering or exiting a medical facility by physically:

19 (1) detaining the other; or

20 (2) obstructing, impeding, or hindering the other's passage.

21 (d) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction
22 is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 90 days or a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or both.

24 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, "RELIGIOUS FACILITY" MEANS REAL PROPERTY
25 THAT IS OWNED, LEASED, OR USED BY A RELIGIOUS ENTITY OR FOR ANY RELIGIOUS
26 PURPOSE

27 (2) "RELIGIOUS FACILITY" INCLUDES:

(I) A PLACE OF WORSHIP:

(II) A CEMETERY;

(III) A RELIGIOUS SCHOOL, EDUCATIONAL FACILITY, OR
TER; AND

(IV) THE GROUNDS ADJACENT TO THEM.

(B) (1) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:

(I) THE PERSON IN CHARGE OF THE RELIGIOUS FACILITY;

(II) A DESIGNEE OF THE PERSON IN CHARGE OF THE RELIGIOUS

(III) AN AGENT OF THE RELIGIOUS FACILITY;

(IV) A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER; OR

(V) A PERSON:

**1. AUTHORIZED BY THE RELIGIOUS AUTHORITY TO
US FACILITY OR THE RELIGIOUS FACILITY'S ACTIVITIES; OR**

2. OTHERWISE ACTING IN GOOD FAITH ON THE BEHALF TO PROTECT THE RELIGIOUS FACILITY OR THE ACTIVITIES.

(2) THIS SECTION DOES NOT PROHIBIT SPEECH.

(C) A RELIGIOUS FACILITY HAS SOLE DISCRETION IN DETERMINING WHO
BE ON THE RELIGIOUS FACILITY'S PREMISES, AS DETERMINED BY THE
INTERNAL DICTATES OF THE RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATION.

(D) A PERSON MAY NOT INTENTIONALLY ACT, ALONE OR WITH OTHERS, TO DENT ANOTHER FROM ENTERING OR EXITING A RELIGIOUS FACILITY BY ICALLY:

(1) DETAINING THE OTHER; OR

(2) OBSTRUCTING, IMPEDING, OR HINDERING THE OTHER'S PASSAGE.

1 **(E) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR**
2 **AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 90 DAYS OR A**
3 **FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 OR BOTH.**

5 A person may not deface, damage, or destroy, or attempt or threaten to deface,
6 damage, or destroy, personal or real property that is owned, leased, or used by a religious
7 entity or for any religious purpose including:

- 8 (1) a place of worship;
- 9 (2) a cemetery;
- 10 (3) a religious school, educational facility, or community center; and
- 11 (4) the grounds adjacent to them.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2026.
