1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Utilities – For-Hire Drivers and Transportation Network Operators –**
3 **Human Trafficking Awareness and Prevention Training and Liability**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring an applicant for certain for-hire driver's licenses ~~and~~
5 ~~transportation network operator's licenses~~ to submit to the Public Service
6 Commission documentation verifying that the applicant completed a certain human
7 trafficking awareness training program; prohibiting licensed taxicab drivers,
8 for-hire drivers, or transportation network operators and applicants for a
9 transportation network operator's license from being held civilly or criminally liable
10 for reporting or responding to in good faith a suspected incident of human trafficking;
11 prohibiting a transportation network company from allowing certain applicants for
12 and holders of a transportation network operator's license to provide transportation
13 network services using a digital network application if the applicant or license holder

B. a search of the Sex Offender Registry; and

 10 than 3 years, as the Commission sets.

11 (b) (1) An applicant for a renewal of a for-hire driver's license shall:

12 (I) submit to the Commission an application on the form that the

14 (II) INCLUDE IN THE APPLICATION DOCUMENTATION

5 (2) A TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY MAY NOT ALLOW AN
6 APPLICANT FOR A TRANSPORTATION NETWORK OPERATOR'S LICENSE OR THE
7 HOLDER OF A TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT TRANSPORTATION NETWORK
8 OPERATOR'S LICENSE TO PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION NETWORK SERVICES USING A
9 DIGITAL NETWORK APPLICATION UNLESS THE APPLICANT OR LICENSE HOLDER,
10 WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE APPLICANT OR LICENSE HOLDER FIRST PROVIDES A
11 PREARRANGED RIDE, HAS COMPLETED:

20 (3) A HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS TRAINING THAT AN
21 APPLICANT OR LICENSE HOLDER COMPLETES UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
22 SUBSECTION MUST INCLUDE INFORMATION ON HOW TO:

23 (I) RECOGNIZE POTENTIAL VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING;

24 (II) RESPOND TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO MAY BE OR IS A VICTIM OF
25 HUMAN TRAFFICKING; AND

26 (III) ~~CONNECT AN INDIVIDUAL WHO MAY BE OR IS A VICTIM~~
27 REPORT SUSPECTED INCIDENTS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING WITH AVAILABLE
28 RESOURCES TO APPROPRIATE AUTHORITIES.

29 (4) AN APPLICANT FOR A TRANSPORTATION NETWORK OPERATOR'S
30 LICENSE OR THE HOLDER OF A TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT TRANSPORTATION
31 NETWORK OPERATOR'S LICENSE MAY NOT BE HELD CIVILLY OR CRIMINALLY LIABLE
32 FOR REPORTING OR RESPONDING IN GOOD FAITH TO A SUSPECTED INCIDENT OF
33 HUMAN TRAFFICKING.
