2 Anne Arundel County and the City of Annapolis, Montgomery, and Prince
3 George's Counties – Crosswalk Monitoring Systems – Authorization

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the use of crosswalk monitoring systems in Anne Arundel
5 ~~County and the City of Annapolis, Montgomery, and Prince George's counties and~~
6 municipalities in those counties, if authorized by local law; requiring the fines
7 collected by a political subdivision as a result of violations enforced by a crosswalk
8 monitoring system to be used to improve safety at certain crosswalks by funding the
9 implementation of infrastructure enhancements; providing that certain provisions of
10 law and protections relating to the inspection, use, removal, and destruction of
11 recorded images and associated data apply to recorded images produced by a
12 crosswalk monitoring system; providing that the owner or driver of a motor vehicle
13 recorded failing to yield to a pedestrian crossing a roadway in a crosswalk is subject
14 to a citation and a certain civil penalty under certain circumstances; establishing
15 certain defenses to a charge of an alleged violation recorded by a crosswalk
16 monitoring system; prohibiting a contractor administering a crosswalk monitoring
17 system from being compensated in a certain manner; and generally relating to the
18 use of crosswalk monitoring systems in Anne Arundel County and the City of
19 Annapolis, Montgomery, and Prince George's counties and municipalities in those
20 counties.

6 (ii) On receipt of the notice to stand trial, the agency shall forward
7 to the District Court having venue a copy of the citation and a copy of the notice from the
8 person who received the citation indicating the person’s intention to stand trial.

9 (iii) On receipt thereof, the District Court shall schedule the case for
10 trial and notify the defendant of the trial date under procedures adopted by the Chief Judge
11 of the District Court.

14 (3) (i) Except as provided in subparagraphs (ii) and (iii) of this

16 issued using a vehicle height monitoring system, traffic control signal monitoring system,
17 speed monitoring system, work zone speed control system, stop sign monitoring system,
18 **CROSSWALK MONITORING SYSTEM**, school bus monitoring camera, bus lane monitoring
19 system, or a noise abatement monitoring system that are collected by the District Court
20 shall be collected in accordance with subsection (a) of this section and distributed in
21 accordance with § 12–118 of the Transportation Article.

22 (ii) 1. The fines collected by the District Court as a result of
23 violations enforced by speed monitoring systems on Interstate 695 in Baltimore County and
24 Interstate 83 in Baltimore County shall be remitted to the Comptroller for distribution to
25 the State Highway Administration to be used solely to:

26 A. Recover the cost of implementing and administering the
27 speed monitoring systems on Interstate 695 in Baltimore County and Interstate 83 in
28 Baltimore County; and

29 B. Assist in covering the cost of roadway and safety
30 improvements on Interstate 695 in Baltimore County and Interstate 83 in Baltimore
31 County.

2. Fines distributed to the State Highway Administration under subparagraph 1 of this subparagraph are supplemental to and are not intended to take the place of funding that would otherwise be appropriated for uses described under subparagraph 1 of this subparagraph.

(iii) Civil penalties resulting from citations issued using a speed monitoring system controlled by the Maryland Transportation Authority that are collected by the District Court shall be collected in accordance with subsection (a) of this section and remitted to the Maryland Transportation Authority.

(4) (i) Except as provided in paragraphs (5) and (6) of this subsection, from the fines collected by a political subdivision as a result of violations enforced by speed monitoring systems, work zone speed control systems, stop sign monitoring systems, **CROSSWALK MONITORING SYSTEMS**, school bus monitoring cameras, bus lane monitoring systems, or noise abatement monitoring systems, a political subdivision:

1. May recover the costs of implementing and administering the speed monitoring systems, work zone speed control systems, stop sign monitoring systems, school bus monitoring cameras, **CROSSWALK MONITORING SYSTEMS**, bus lane monitoring systems, or noise abatement monitoring systems; and

2. Subject to subparagraphs (ii), (iii), ~~and~~ (iv), **AND (VIII)** of this paragraph, may spend any remaining balance solely for public safety purposes, including pedestrian or highway safety programs.

(VIII) FROM THE FINES COLLECTED BY A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION AS A RESULT OF VIOLATIONS ENFORCED BY CROSSWALK MONITORING SYSTEMS PLACED IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 21-502.2 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE, ANY BALANCE REMAINING AFTER THE ALLOCATION OF FINES UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I)1 OF THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL BE USED TO IMPROVE SAFETY AT CROSSWALKS AT WHICH A CROSSWALK MONITORING SYSTEM IS PLACED BY FUNDING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF INFRASTRUCTURE ENHANCEMENTS INCLUDING:

- 1. HAWK SIGNALS;**
- 2. BEACONS;**
- 3. RAISED CROSSWALKS;**
- 4. PYLONS; AND**
- 5. PEDESTRIAN PUSH-BUTTON SYSTEMS.**

1 (a) A recorded image of a motor vehicle produced by a traffic control signal
2 monitoring system in accordance with § 21–202.1 of the Transportation Article is
3 admissible in a proceeding concerning a civil citation issued under that section for a
4 violation of § 21–202(h) of the Transportation Article without authentication.

7 proceeding concerning a civil citation issued under that section for a violation of Title 21,

9 (c) A recorded image of a motor vehicle produced by a school bus monitoring
10 camera in accordance with § 21–706.1 of the Transportation Article is admissible in a
11 proceeding concerning a civil citation issued under that section for a violation of § 21–706

13 (d) A recorded image of a motor vehicle produced by a vehicle height monitoring
14 system in accordance with § 24–111.3 of the Transportation Article is admissible in a
15 proceeding concerning a civil citation issued under that section for a violation of a State or
16 local law restricting the presence of certain vehicles during certain times without
17 authentication.

18 (e) A recorded image of a motor vehicle produced by a bus lane monitoring system
19 in accordance with § 21–1134 of the Transportation Article is admissible in a proceeding
20 concerning a civil citation issued under that section for a violation of § 21–1133 of the
21 Transportation Article without authentication.

22 (f) A recorded image of a motor vehicle and any relevant recorded audio produced
23 by a noise abatement monitoring system in conjunction with a noise measuring device in
24 accordance with § 22–612 of the Transportation Article is admissible in a proceeding
25 concerning a civil citation issued under that section for a violation of § 22–602 of the
26 Transportation Article without authentication.

27 (g) A recorded image of a motor vehicle produced by a stop sign monitoring system
28 in accordance with § 21–707.1 of the Transportation Article is admissible in a proceeding
29 concerning a civil citation issued under that section for a violation of § 21–707 of the
30 Transportation Article without authentication.

31 (h) **A RECORDED IMAGE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE PRODUCED BY A CROSSWALK**

4 LICENSE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER OF THE PERSON WHO WAS OPERATING THE
5 VEHICLE AT THE TIME OF THE VIOLATION.

6 (5) (I) IF THE DISTRICT COURT FINDS THAT THE PERSON NAMED
7 IN THE CITATION WAS NOT OPERATING THE VEHICLE AT THE TIME OF THE
8 VIOLATION OR RECEIVES EVIDENCE UNDER PARAGRAPH (4)(II)2 OF THIS

14 2027, ~~the Anne Arundel County Council and the Annapolis City Council shall jointly~~ Anne
15 Arundel County, Montgomery County, and Prince George's County, respectively, jointly
16 with any municipalities in the respective counties that implement and use crosswalk
17 monitoring systems, shall report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the
18 State Government Article, the General Assembly on:

19 (1) through October 1, 2027:

20 (i) the time period during which crosswalk monitoring systems were
21 in use in the local jurisdiction; and

22 (ii) the number of warnings and citations issued as a result of

29 (3) appropriate locations for the deployment of crosswalk monitoring
30 systems;

31 (4) the performance and reliability of crosswalk monitoring systems used
32 by the local jurisdiction; and

1 (5) the effectiveness of crosswalk monitoring systems in reducing
2 violations, crashes, and pedestrian injuries in the local jurisdiction generally and in areas
3 where the crosswalk monitoring systems were implemented and used.

4 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
5 1, 2026. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June 30, 2031,
6 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and
7 of no further force and effect.
