4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to consult with a certain
5 entity that operates the donor registry and procurement organizations in the
6 development, updating, or approving of certain educational materials relating to
7 organ, eye, and tissue donation; and generally relating to educational materials
8 relating to organ, eye, and tissue donation.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Education

1–101.

(a) In this article, unless the context requires otherwise, the following words have the meanings indicated.

(f) “Department” means the State Department of Education.

7–455.

(A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

(2) “DONOR REGISTRY” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 4–501 OF THE ESTATES AND TRUSTS ARTICLE.

(3) “PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATION” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 4–501 OF THE ESTATES AND TRUSTS ARTICLE.

(B) IF THE DEPARTMENT DEVELOPS, UPDATES, OR APPROVES CURRICULUM GUIDANCE, INSTRUCTIONAL RESOURCES, OR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT MATERIALS REGARDING ORGAN, EYE, AND TISSUE DONATION FOR USE BY COUNTY BOARDS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CONSULT WITH:

(1) THE QUALIFIED NONPROFIT ENTITY THAT OPERATES THE DONOR REGISTRY UNDER § 4–516 OF THE ESTATES AND TRUSTS ARTICLE; AND

(2) PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATIONS SERVING IN THE STATE.

(C) THE DEPARTMENT MAY USE OR REFERENCE EXISTING EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS THAT WERE PREVIOUSLY DEVELOPED BY OR BEING USED BY THE DONOR REGISTRY OR A PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATION IF THE EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS ARE:

(1) AGE APPROPRIATE;

(2) EVIDENCE–BASED AND MEDICALLY ACCURATE; AND

6 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

7 (h) “Donor registry” means a database that contains records of anatomical gifts
8 and amendments to or revocations of anatomical gifts as provided in § 4–516 of this subtitle.

9 (r) “Organ procurement organization” means a person designated by the
10 Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services as an organ
11 procurement organization.

12 (v) “Procurement organization” means an eye bank, an organ procurement
13 organization, or a tissue bank.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
15 1, 2026.
