3 **Programs**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health to adopt regulations
5 that authorize a residential service agency to provide training to a licensed nurse
6 after hire; authorizing a residential service agency that provides private duty
7 nursing services to employ a licensed nurse who does not meet certain requirements
8 under certain circumstances; requiring a residential service agency to provide
9 training and a competency evaluation for certain nurses; and generally relating to
10 residential service agencies.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article – Health – General**

2 19–4A–03.

3 (a) The Department shall adopt regulations that set standards for the care,
4 treatment, health, safety, welfare, and comfort of individuals who receive home health care
5 services through a residential service agency.

6 (b) The regulations shall provide for the licensing of residential service agencies.

7 (c) The regulations shall include provisions that:

8 (1) Provide for the establishment of residential service agencies;

9 (2) Establish qualifications for licensure;

10 (3) Set minimum standards for individuals who provide home health care
11 services through a residential service agency; [and]12 (4) Require the residential service agency to screen and verify the
13 character references of all home health care providers that are employed by the residential
14 service agency; AND15 **(5) AUTHORIZE A RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY TO PROVIDE**
16 **TRAINING TO A LICENSED NURSE AFTER HIRE IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 19–4A–03.2**

20 **NURSING SERVICES MAY EMPLOY A LICENSED NURSE WHO DOES NOT MEET THE**
21 **CLINICAL EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT IF THE**
22 **RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY PROVIDES TRAINING AND A COMPETENCY**
23 **EVALUATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION.**24 **(B) A RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY THAT SEEKS TO EMPLOY A NURSE**
25 **DESCRIBED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL:**26 **(1) ESTABLISH AND IMPLEMENT A TRAINING PROGRAM DESIGNED TO**
27 **ENSURE SAFE AND COMPETENT CARE BASED ON PATIENT NEEDS;**28 **(2) ENSURE THE NURSE RECEIVES CLINICAL SUPERVISION BY A**
29 **REGISTERED NURSE QUALIFIED IN PRIVATE DUTY NURSING SERVICES;**

1 **(3) ASSIGN THE NURSE TO A QUALIFIED PRECEPTOR OR CLINICAL**
2 **SUPERVISOR UNTIL COMPETENCY IS DEMONSTRATED;**

3 **(4) DOCUMENT SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF REQUIRED**
4 **COMPETENCY STANDARDS IN THE NURSE’S PERSONNEL FILE; AND**

5 **(5) CONDUCT COMPETENCY EVALUATIONS OF THE NURSE:**

6 **(I) ANNUALLY; OR**

7 **(II) FOR DISCIPLINARY PURPOSES, ON A MORE FREQUENT**
8 **SCHEDULE AS REQUIRED BY THE DEPARTMENT.**

9 **(C) A TRAINING PROGRAM AND COMPETENCY EVALUATION REQUIRED**
10 **UNDER THIS SECTION ARE SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE DEPARTMENT.**

11 **(D) THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO AFFECT REQUIREMENTS**
12 **RELATING TO OCCUPATIONAL LICENSURE, SCOPE OF PRACTICE, OR STANDARDS OF**
13 **CARE.**

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15 October 1, 2026.
