A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Information Act – Inspectors General – Access of Public Records**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a custodian to allow a certain inspector general to inspect a
4 public record under certain circumstances; providing that redisclosure of certain
5 information is subject to certain restrictions; and generally relating to access to
6 public records by inspectors general.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – General Provisions**

15 4–301.

16 (a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section, a custodian shall deny inspection of a
17 public record or any part of a public record if:

18 (1) by law, the public record is privileged or confidential; or

19 (2) the inspection would be contrary to:

20 (i) a State statute;

21 (ii) a federal statute or a regulation that is issued under the statute
22 and has the force of law;

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

1 (iii) the rules adopted by the Supreme Court of Maryland; or

2 (iv) an order of a court of record.

3 (b) If an applicant files a complaint with the Ombudsman challenging a denial or
4 the application of an exemption under this subtitle, the custodian shall demonstrate that:

5 (1) the denial or the exemption is clearly applicable to the requested public
6 record; and

7 (2) if inspection is denied under Part IV of this subtitle, the harm from
8 disclosure of the public record is greater than the public interest in access to the information
9 in the public record.

10 (c) (1) **NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE, A**
11 **CUSTODIAN SHALL ALLOW AN INSPECTOR GENERAL WHOSE OFFICE IS CREATED BY**
12 **STATE LAW OR LOCAL LAW TO INSPECT A PUBLIC RECORD OR ANY PART OF A PUBLIC**
13 **RECORD IF:**

14 (i) **A STATE OR LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZES THE INSPECTOR**
15 **GENERAL TO HAVE ACCESS TO AND INSPECT THE PUBLIC RECORD; AND**

16 (ii) **THE INSPECTOR GENERAL REQUIRES ACCESS TO THE**
17 **PUBLIC RECORD TO PERFORM THE INSPECTOR GENERAL'S DUTIES.**

18 (2) **ANY REDISCLOSURE BY AN INSPECTOR GENERAL OF A PUBLIC**
19 **RECORD RECEIVED UNDER THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS**
20 **TITLE.**

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
22 October 1, 2026.
