A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Service Animal Programs – Participant Disqualification – Revisions**

3 FOR the purpose of revising provisions related to the disqualification of a program
4 participant from the Maryland Children’s Service Animal Program or the Maryland
5 Veterans Service Animal Program; and generally relating to the Maryland
6 Children’s Service Animal Program and the Maryland Veterans Service Animal
7 Program.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Health – General**

21 13–4101.

22 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



(b) “Eligible child” means a child who has a history of trauma, has been diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder, or has been diagnosed with a developmental disability and special health care need under Title V of the Social Security Act.

(C) “DIRECT THREAT” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN THE FEDERAL AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT.

[(c)] (D) “Fund” means the Maryland Children’s Service Animal Program Fund established under § 13–4105 of this subtitle.

[(d)] (E) “Nonprofit training entity” means a corporation, a foundation, or any other legal entity that:

(1) Is qualified under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code;

(2) (i) Engages in the training of service dogs or support dogs for use by children; or

(ii) Uses trained therapy horses for interaction with children; and

(3) Has been selected by the Department to provide services under this subtitle.

[(e)] (F) “Program” means the Maryland Children’s Service Animal Program established under § 13–4102 of this subtitle.

[(f)] (G) “Program participant” means an eligible child who participates in the Program.

[(g)] (H) “Successful Program participant” means a Program participant who successfully completes the training or therapy protocol specified by a nonprofit training entity.

13–4104.

(a) A nonprofit training entity may disqualify a Program participant from participation in the Program if the nonprofit training entity determines that the Program participant’s involvement in the Program:

(1) Presents a danger to the Program participant’s mental or physical well-being;

(2) **[Is] PRESENTS** a direct threat to **[the health and safety of]** others;

(3) Presents a direct threat to the mental or physical well-being of the service dog, support dog, or therapy horse; or

(4) Does not meet the training requirements of the nonprofit training entity.

(b) A Program participant may discontinue involvement in the Program for any reason.

Article – State Government

9–957.

(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

(2) “Eligible family member” means a spouse or dependent of an eligible veteran.

(3) “DIRECT THREAT” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN THE FEDERAL AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT.

[(3)] (4) “Eligible veteran” means a veteran who:

(i) is a resident of the State; or

(ii) receives treatment or care from a U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs or U.S. Department of Defense medical facility in the State.

[(4)] (5) “Fund” means the Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program Fund established under subsection (f) of this section.

[(5)] (6) “Nonprofit training entity” means a corporation, a foundation, or any other legal entity that:

(i) is qualified under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code;

(ii) 1. engages in the training of service dogs or support dogs for use by veterans; or

2. uses trained therapy horses for interaction with veterans; and

(iii) has been selected by the Department to provide services under this section.

[(6)] (7) “Program” means the Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program established under subsection (b) of this section.

1 **[(7)] (8)** “Program participant” means an eligible veteran or eligible
2 family member who participates in the Program.

3 **[(8)] (9)** “Service dog” means a dog that is individually trained to do work
4 or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including physical,
5 sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability.

6 **[(9)] (10)** “Successful Program participant” means a Program participant
7 who successfully completes the training or therapy protocol specified by a nonprofit training
8 entity.

9 **[(10)] (11)** “Support dog” means a dog that is individually trained and that
10 serves as an emotional support or therapy animal that a medical professional, within the
11 medical professional’s scope of practice, has determined provides benefit for an individual
12 with a sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability.

13 **[(11)] (12)** “Therapy horse” includes a horse determined appropriate for
14 interactions with veterans by a stable licensed by the State that:

15 (i) is a Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship,
16 International (PATH, Intl.) member center; or

17 (ii) has Equine Assisted Growth and Learning Association
18 (EAGALA) certified professionals who provide services to veterans.

19 (e) (1) A nonprofit training entity may disqualify a Program participant from
20 participation in the Program if the nonprofit training entity determines that the Program
21 participant’s involvement in the Program:

22 (i) presents a danger to the Program participant’s mental or
23 physical well-being;

24 (ii) [has caused or may potentially cause harm] **PRESENTS A**
25 **DIRECT THREAT** to others[, an animal, or property];

26 (iii) presents a [danger] **DIRECT THREAT** to the **MENTAL OR**
27 **PHYSICAL WELL-BEING OF THE** service [dog’s] **DOG**, support [dog’s] **DOG**, or therapy
28 [horse’s mental or physical well-being] **HORSE**; or

29 (iv) does not meet the training requirement of the nonprofit
30 **TRAINING ENTITY**.

31 (2) A Program participant may discontinue involvement in the Program for
32 any reason.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
2 October 1, 2026.
