A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Civil Actions – Maryland Uniform Public Expression Protection Act**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain provision relating to strategic lawsuits against
4 public participation; authorizing a person served with a pleading asserting a certain
5 cause of action based on the person's communication related to a governmental
6 proceeding or exercise of certain constitutional rights to file a special motion for
7 expedited relief to dismiss the cause of action; and generally relating to civil actions
8 and public expression.

26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
27 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (a) In this section, "SLAPP suit" means a strategic lawsuit against public
4 participation.

5 (b) A lawsuit is a SLAPP suit if it is:

12 (2) Materially related to the defendant's communication; and

16 (c) A defendant in a SLAPP suit is not civilly liable for communicating with a
17 federal, State, or local government body or the public at large, if the defendant, without
18 constitutional malice, reports on, comments on, rules on, challenges, opposes, or in any
19 other way exercises rights under the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution or Article
20 10, Article 13, or Article 40 of the Maryland Declaration of Rights regarding any matter
21 within the authority of a government body or any issue of public concern.

22 (d) A defendant in an alleged SLAPP suit may move to:

23 (1) Dismiss the alleged SLAPP suit, in which case the court shall hold a
24 hearing on the motion to dismiss as soon as practicable; or

25 (2) Stay all court proceedings until the matter about which the defendant
26 communicated to the government body or the public at large is resolved.

27 (e) This section:

28 (1) Is applicable to SLAPP suits notwithstanding any other law or rule; and

29 (2) Does not diminish any equitable or legal right or remedy otherwise
30 available to a defendant in a SLAPP suit.]

1 (D) DURING A STAY UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, THE COURT
2 MAY ALLOW LIMITED DISCOVERY IF:

3 (1) A PARTY SHOWS THAT SPECIFIC INFORMATION IS NECESSARY TO
4 ESTABLISH WHETHER A PARTY HAS SATISFIED OR FAILED TO SATISFY A BURDEN
5 UNDER § 5-1307(A) OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND

6 (2) THE INFORMATION IS NOT REASONABLY AVAILABLE UNLESS
7 DISCOVERY IS ALLOWED.

8 (E) A MOTION UNDER § 5-1310 OF THIS SUBTITLE FOR COSTS, ATTORNEY'S
9 FEES, AND EXPENSES IS NOT SUBJECT TO A STAY UNDER THIS SECTION.

10 (F) A STAY UNDER THIS SECTION DOES NOT AFFECT A PARTY'S ABILITY TO:

11 (1) VOLUNTARILY DISMISS A CAUSE OF ACTION OR PART OF A CAUSE
12 OF ACTION; OR

13 (2) MOVE TO SEVER A CAUSE OF ACTION.

14 (G) DURING A STAY UNDER THIS SECTION, THE COURT FOR GOOD CAUSE
15 SHOWN MAY HEAR AND RULE ON:

16 (1) A MOTION UNRELATED TO THE MOTION UNDER § 5-1303 OF THIS
17 SUBTITLE; OR

18 (2) A MOTION SEEKING A SPECIAL OR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION TO
19 PROTECT AGAINST AN IMMINENT THREAT TO PUBLIC HEALTH OR SAFETY.

21 (A) THE COURT SHALL HEAR A MOTION UNDER § 5-1303 OF THIS SUBTITLE
22 NOT LATER THAN 60 DAYS AFTER THE FILING OF THE MOTION, UNLESS THE COURT
23 ORDERS A LATER HEARING:

24 (1) TO ALLOW DISCOVERY UNDER § 5-1304(D) OF THIS SUBTITLE; OR

25 (2) FOR OTHER GOOD CAUSE SHOWN.

26 (B) IF THE COURT ORDERS A LATER HEARING UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(1) OF
27 THIS SECTION, THE COURT SHALL HEAR THE MOTION UNDER § 5-1303 OF THIS
28 SUBTITLE NOT LATER THAN 60 DAYS AFTER THE COURT ORDER ALLOWING THE

1 DISCOVERY, UNLESS THE COURT ORDERS A LATER HEARING UNDER SUBSECTION
2 (A)(2) OF THIS SECTION.

4 IN RULING ON A MOTION UNDER § 5-1303 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE COURT
5 SHALL CONSIDER:

6 (1) THE PLEADINGS;

7 (2) THE MOTION;

8 (3) ANY REPLY OR RESPONSE TO THE MOTION; AND

9 (4) ANY EVIDENCE THAT COULD BE CONSIDERED IN RULING ON A
10 MOTION FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MARYLAND RULES.

11 **5-1307.**

12 (A) IN RULING ON A MOTION UNDER § 5-1303 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE
13 COURT SHALL DISMISS WITH PREJUDICE A CAUSE OF ACTION OR A PART OF A CAUSE
14 OF ACTION IF:

15 (1) THE MOVING PARTY ESTABLISHES UNDER § 5-1302(A) OF THIS
16 SUBTITLE THAT THIS SUBTITLE APPLIES;

17 (2) THE RESPONDING PARTY FAILS TO ESTABLISH UNDER §
18 5-1302(B) OF THIS SUBTITLE THAT THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT APPLY; AND

19 (3) (I) THE RESPONDING PARTY FAILS TO ESTABLISH A PRIMA
20 FACIE CASE AS TO EACH ESSENTIAL ELEMENT OF THE CAUSE OF ACTION; OR

21 (II) THE MOVING PARTY ESTABLISHES THAT:

22 1. THE RESPONDING PARTY FAILED TO STATE A CAUSE
23 OF ACTION UPON WHICH RELIEF CAN BE GRANTED; OR

24 2. THERE IS NO GENUINE ISSUE AS TO ANY MATERIAL
25 FACT AND THE MOVING PARTY IS ENTITLED TO JUDGMENT AS A MATTER OF LAW ON
26 THE CAUSE OF ACTION OR PART OF THE CAUSE OF ACTION.

27 (B) A VOLUNTARY DISMISSAL WITHOUT PREJUDICE OF A RESPONDING
28 PARTY'S CAUSE OF ACTION, OR PART OF A CAUSE OF ACTION, THAT IS THE SUBJECT

1 OF A MOTION UNDER § 5-1303 OF THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT AFFECT A MOVING
2 PARTY'S RIGHT TO OBTAIN A RULING ON THE MOTION AND SEEK COSTS, ATTORNEY'S
3 FEES, AND EXPENSES UNDER § 5-1310 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

4 (C) A VOLUNTARY DISMISSAL WITH PREJUDICE OF A RESPONDING PARTY'S
5 CAUSE OF ACTION, OR PART OF A CAUSE OF ACTION, THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF A
6 MOTION UNDER § 5-1303 OF THIS SUBTITLE ESTABLISHES FOR THE PURPOSE OF §
7 5-1310 OF THIS SUBTITLE THAT THE MOVING PARTY PREVAILED ON THE MOTION.

8 **5-1308.**

9 THE COURT SHALL RULE ON A MOTION UNDER § 5-1303 OF THIS SUBTITLE
10 NOT LATER THAN 60 DAYS AFTER A HEARING UNDER § 5-1305 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

11 **5-1309.**

12 (A) A MOVING PARTY MAY APPEAL AS A MATTER OF RIGHT FROM AN ORDER
13 DENYING, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, A MOTION UNDER § 5-1303 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

14 (B) AN APPEAL UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE FILED NOT LATER THAN 21
15 DAYS AFTER ENTRY OF THE ORDER.

16 **5-1310.**

17 ON A MOTION UNDER § 5-1303 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE COURT SHALL AWARD
18 COURT COSTS, REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES, AND REASONABLE LITIGATION
19 EXPENSES RELATED TO THE MOTION:

20 (1) TO THE MOVING PARTY IF THE MOVING PARTY PREVAILS ON THE
21 MOTION; OR

22 (2) TO THE RESPONDING PARTY IF THE RESPONDING PARTY
23 PREVAILS ON THE MOTION AND THE COURT FINDS THAT THE MOTION WAS
24 FRIVOLOUS OR FILED SOLELY WITH INTENT TO DELAY THE PROCEEDING.

26 THIS SUBTITLE SHALL BE BROADLY CONSTRUED AND APPLIED TO PROTECT
27 THE EXERCISE OF THE RIGHT OF FREEDOM OF SPEECH AND OF THE PRESS, THE
28 RIGHT TO ASSEMBLE AND PETITION, AND THE RIGHT OF ASSOCIATION,
29 GUARANTEED BY THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION, THE MARYLAND
30 DECLARATION OF RIGHTS, AND THE MARYLAND CONSTITUTION.

2 **IN APPLYING AND CONSTRUING THIS SUBTITLE, CONSIDERATION SHALL BE**
3 **GIVEN TO THE NEED TO PROMOTE UNIFORMITY OF THE LAW WITH RESPECT TO ITS**
4 **SUBJECT MATTER AMONG THE STATES THAT ENACT IT.**

6 **THIS SUBTITLE MAY BE CITED AS THE MARYLAND UNIFORM PUBLIC**

9 **Courts and Judicial Proceedings of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be**
10 **Section(s) 5-807.**

11 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to**
12 **apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or**
13 **application to any cause of action arising before the effective date of this Act.**

14 **SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect**
15 **October 1, 2026.**
