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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – Law Enforcement Agencies – Use of Body–Worn Cameras**

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain provisions of law to require a law enforcement agency  
4 to require the use of body–worn cameras, subject to a certain policy, by each sworn  
5 law enforcement officer, regardless of rank, employed by the law enforcement agency  
6 while the officer is in uniform, in public, and conducting law enforcement–related  
7 duties; and generally relating to the use of body–worn cameras by law enforcement  
8 officers.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Public Safety**

17 3–511.

18 (c) [(1) (i) This paragraph applies to:

- 19 1. the Department of State Police;
- 20 2. the Anne Arundel County Police Department;
- 21 3. the Howard County Police Department; and

(ii) On or before July 1, 2023, a] A law enforcement agency [to which this paragraph applies] shall require the use of body-worn cameras, subject to the policy on the use of body-worn cameras developed by the law enforcement agency, by each **SWORN** law enforcement officer, **REGARDLESS OF RANK**, employed by the law enforcement agency [who regularly interacts with members of the public as part of the law enforcement officer's official duties] **WHILE THE OFFICER IS IN UNIFORM, IN PUBLIC, AND CONDUCTING LAW ENFORCEMENT-RELATED DUTIES.**

[(2) On or before July 1, 2025, a law enforcement agency of a county, other than a law enforcement agency described in paragraph (1) of this subsection, shall require the use of body-worn cameras, subject to the policy on the use of body-worn cameras developed by the law enforcement agency, by each law enforcement officer employed by the law enforcement agency who regularly interacts with members of the public as part of the law enforcement officer's official duties.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2026.
