A BILL ENTITLED

4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Maryland–Ireland Trade Commission;
5 extending the termination date of the Commission; and generally relating to the

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 **Article – Economic Development**

23 5–2501.

24 In this subtitle, “Commission” means the Maryland–Ireland Trade Commission.

1 5–2502.

2 (a) There is a Maryland–Ireland Trade Commission in the Department.

3 (b) The purpose of the Commission is to study and promote trade between
4 Maryland and Ireland.

5 5–2503.

6 (a) The Commission consists of the following members:

7 (1) the Secretary, or the Secretary’s designee;

8 (2) the Secretary of State, or the Secretary of State’s designee;

9 (3) [two members] **ONE MEMBER** of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by
10 the President of the Senate, who [have] **HAS** knowledge of organizations that promote Irish
11 affairs, or current or past involvement in organizations that promote Irish affairs, or [have]
12 **HAS** an interest in the well–being of trade relations between Maryland and Ireland;

13 (4) [two members] **ONE MEMBER** of the House of Delegates, appointed by
14 the Speaker of the House, who [have] **HAS** knowledge of organizations that promote Irish
15 affairs, or current or past involvement in organizations that promote Irish affairs, or [have]
16 **HAS** an interest in the well–being of trade relations between Maryland and Ireland; and

17 (5) the following members, appointed by the Governor, with the advice and
18 consent of the Senate:

19 (i) one representative of a public institution of higher education;

20 (ii) one representative of the Maryland Chamber of Commerce or its
21 successor organization; [and]

22 (iii) two representatives of the Irish–American community, who may
23 not be of the same political party; **AND**

24 **(IV) TWO MEMBERS OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR.**

25 (b) The chair and vice chair of the Commission shall be elected from among the
26 members of the Commission.

27 (c) A member of the Commission:

28 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Commission; but

(2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

(d) The Governor may remove an appointed member for incompetence, misconduct, or failure to perform the duties of the position.

5–2504.

(a) The Commission shall study and make recommendations regarding:

(1) advancing bilateral trade and investment between Maryland and Ireland;

(2) initiating joint action on policy issues of mutual interest to Maryland and Ireland;

(3) promoting business and academic exchanges between Maryland and Ireland;

(4) encouraging mutual economic support between Maryland and Ireland;

(5) encouraging mutual investment in the infrastructure of Maryland and Ireland; and

(6) other issues as determined by the Commission.

(b) On or before December 1, 2025, **AND EACH DECEMBER 1 THEREAFTER**, the Commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

Chapter 409 of the Acts of 2024

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of [2] 4 years and, at the end of September 30, [2026] **2028**, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2026.
