## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 **State Acupuncture Board – Revisions**

3 FOR the purpose of defining “manual therapies” as it relates to the practice of acupuncture;  
4 requiring the State Acupuncture Board to make available proof of renewal, rather  
5 than issuing a renewal certificate; prohibiting a person from employing an individual  
6 to practice acupuncture without a license or aiding or abetting the unauthorized  
7 practice of acupuncture; and generally relating to the practice of acupuncture.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### 20 **Article – Health Occupations**

22 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

(b) "Acupuncture" means a form of health care based on East Asian medical theories of energetic physiology that describe the interrelationship of the body organs and functions.

4 (c) "Auricular detoxification" means an acupuncture technique involving the  
5 needling of the external auricle of the human ear for the purpose of assisting a person who  
6 is undergoing detoxification to remove addictive substances from the body and restoring  
7 health.

8 (d) "Board" means the State Acupuncture Board.

11 (F) (1) "MANUAL THERAPIES" MEANS TREATMENT MODALITIES THAT  
12 APPLY PRESSURE OR MANIPULATION USING HANDS OR ANOTHER PART OF THE  
13 BODY ALONG POINTS OR MERIDIANS THAT NORMALIZE ELECTROMAGNETIC OR  
14 ENERGETIC FUNCTION.

(2) "MANUAL THERAPIES" INCLUDE ACUPRESSURE OR OTHER PRESSURE TREATMENT TECHNIQUES BASED ON EAST ASIAN MEDICAL THERAPIES.

17        **(f) (G)**      (1)     “Practice acupuncture” means the use of East Asian medical  
18    therapies for the purpose of normalizing energetic physiological functions including pain  
19    control, and for the promotion, maintenance, and restoration of health.

20 (2) "Practice acupuncture" includes:

21 (i) Stimulation of the body by the insertion of needles;

22 (ii) The application of moxibustion; and

23 (iii) Manual **THERAPIES**, mechanical **THERAPIES**, thermal  
24 **THERAPIES**, electrical **THERAPIES**, or other East Asian medical therapies only when  
25 performed in accordance with the principles of East Asian medical theories and practices.

26 [ (g) ] (H) "Supervision" means:

31 (2) As defined by the Board in regulations:

1 (i) Periodic direct supervision where the licensed acupuncturist is  
2 present or on-site during treatment; and

6 (b) The applicant shall:

7 (1) Be of good moral character;

8 (2) Be at least 18 years old;

11 (i) If the applicant is issued a license on or before May 31, 2026:

26 (ii) If the applicant is issued a license on or after June 1, 2026:

9 (4) Demonstrate the ability to communicate in the English language; and

12 (e) The Board shall renew the license of and [issue a renewal certificate] **MAKE**  
13 **AVAILABLE PROOF OF RENEWAL** to each licensee who meets the requirements of this  
14 section.

**EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS TITLE, A PERSON MAY NOT:**

17 (1) EMPLOY AN INDIVIDUAL TO PRACTICE ACUPUNCTURE WITHOUT A  
18 LICENSE; OR

21 [1A-403.] 1A-404.

22 (a) A person who violates [any provision] **§ 1A-401 OR § 1A-402** of this subtitle  
23 is [guilty]:

24                           **(1) GUILTY** of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not  
25 exceeding \$5,000 or imprisonment not exceeding 3 years or both [.

26 (b) A person who violates § 1A-401 or § 1A-402 of this subtitle is subject[; AND]

1           **(B) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES § 1A-403 OF THIS SUBTITLE IS:**

2           **(1) (I) FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON**  
3    **CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT**  
4    **EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR BOTH; AND**

5           **(II) FOR A SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, GUILTY OF A FELONY AND ON**  
6    **CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 PER DAY OR**  
7    **IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 5 YEARS OR BOTH; AND**

8           **(2) SUBJECT TO A CIVIL FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$10,000 TO BE**  
9    **ASSESSED BY THE BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE**  
10   **BOARD.**

11           **(C) THE BOARD SHALL REMIT ANY PENALTY COLLECTED UNDER THIS**  
12   **SECTION INTO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.**

13           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
14   October 1, 2026.
