A BILL ENTITLED

3 FOR the purpose of altering the calculation of certain funding for the State Library

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Education**

19 23–201.

20 (a) The Central Library of the Enoch Pratt Free Library System is the State
21 Library Resource Center.

22 (b) The State Library Resource Center shall provide and expand access to
23 specialized library materials and services that are necessary for coordinated, efficient, and
24 economical library services in this State.

2 (c) (1) Subject to subsection (g) of this section, each year each participating
3 regional resource center shall receive a minimum amount of funding for each resident of
