CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Utilities – For–Hire Drivers and Transportation Network Operators –**
3 **Human Trafficking Awareness and Prevention Training and Liability**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring an applicant for certain for–hire driver’s licenses ~~and~~
5 ~~transportation network operator’s licenses~~ to submit to the Public Service
6 Commission documentation verifying that the applicant completed a certain human
7 trafficking awareness training program; prohibiting licensed taxicab drivers,
8 for–hire drivers, or transportation network operators and applicants for a
9 transportation network operator’s license from being held civilly or criminally liable
10 for reporting or responding to in good faith a suspected incident of human trafficking;
11 prohibiting a transportation network company from allowing certain applicants for
12 and holders of a transportation network operator’s license to provide transportation
13 network services using a digital network application if the applicant or license holder
14 has not completed a certain human trafficking awareness training program; and
15 generally relating to for–hire drivers and transportation network operators.

21 (II) **CONDUCTS A** driving record check of each applicant for a license;

1 (a) The term of a for-hire driver's license is not less than 1 year and not more
2 than 3 years, as the Commission sets.

3 (b) (1) An applicant for a renewal of a for-hire driver's license shall:

6 (II) INCLUDE IN THE APPLICATION DOCUMENTATION

(G) (1) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO:

(I) SUBMITTED AN APPLICATION FOR A TRANSPORTATION NETWORK OPERATOR'S LICENSE ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2026; AND

(II) COMPLETED, BETWEEN JUNE 1, 2025, AND NOVEMBER 30, 2026, A HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS TRAINING THAT MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

(2) A TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY MAY NOT ALLOW AN APPLICANT FOR A TRANSPORTATION NETWORK OPERATOR'S LICENSE OR THE HOLDER OF A TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT TRANSPORTATION NETWORK OPERATOR'S LICENSE TO PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION NETWORK SERVICES USING A DIGITAL NETWORK APPLICATION UNLESS THE APPLICANT OR LICENSE HOLDER, WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE APPLICANT OR LICENSE HOLDER FIRST PROVIDES A PREARRANGED RIDE, HAS COMPLETED:

1 (I) THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION’S LEADERS
2 AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING/COMBATING HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN THE
3 TRANSPORTATION SECTOR AWARENESS TRAINING;

4 (II) ANY NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED HUMAN TRAFFICKING
5 AWARENESS TRAINING PROGRAM; OR

6 (III) ANY DIGITAL TRAINING DEVELOPED BY A TRANSPORTATION
7 NETWORK COMPANY IN CONSULTATION WITH A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED
8 ORGANIZATION WITH EXPERTISE IN HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS TRAINING.

9 (3) A HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS TRAINING THAT AN
10 APPLICANT OR LICENSE HOLDER COMPLETES UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
11 SUBSECTION MUST INCLUDE INFORMATION ON HOW TO:

12 (I) RECOGNIZE POTENTIAL VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING;

13 (II) RESPOND TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO MAY BE OR IS A VICTIM OF
14 HUMAN TRAFFICKING; AND

15 (III) REPORT SUSPECTED INCIDENTS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING
16 TO APPROPRIATE AUTHORITIES.

17 (4) AN APPLICANT FOR A TRANSPORTATION NETWORK OPERATOR’S
18 LICENSE OR THE HOLDER OF A TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT TRANSPORTATION
19 NETWORK OPERATOR’S LICENSE MAY NOT BE HELD CIVILLY OR CRIMINALLY LIABLE
20 FOR REPORTING OR RESPONDING IN GOOD FAITH TO A SUSPECTED INCIDENT OF
21 HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

22 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
23 October 1, 2026.
