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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Higher Education Institutions – Over-the-Counter Contraception – Access and**  
3 **Reporting**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring each public senior higher education institution and  
5 community college to submit a certain report on contraception access to the  
6 Maryland Higher Education Commission each year; requiring the Commission to  
7 submit a certain report on contraception access to the General Assembly each year;  
8 requiring each community college to provide students with access to all methods of  
9 over-the-counter contraception; and generally relating to public senior higher  
10 education institutions and community colleges and contraception access  
11 requirements.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### 24 Article – Education

2 INDICATED.

5 (3) "OVER-THE-COUNTER CONTRACEPTION" MEANS A  
6 CONTRACEPTIVE DRUG OR DEVICE APPROVED BY THE FEDERAL FOOD AND DRUG  
7 ADMINISTRATION THAT CAN BE OBTAINED FOR USE WITHOUT A PRESCRIPTION.

19 (B) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2026, AND EACH SEPTEMBER 1  
20 THEREAFTER, ON A FORM PROVIDED BY THE COMMISSION, EACH PUBLIC SENIOR  
21 HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTION AND COMMUNITY COLLEGE SHALL SUBMIT A  
22 REPORT TO THE COMMISSION ON THE PROVISION OF OVER-THE-COUNTER  
23 CONTRACEPTION ON CAMPUS, INCLUDING:

(3) THE AMOUNT OF OVER-THE-COUNTER CONTRACEPTION PROVIDED ON CAMPUS; AND

12 (a) In this section, "over-the-counter contraception" means a contraceptive drug  
13 or device approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration that can be obtained for  
14 use without a prescription.

15 (b) (1) On or before August 1, 2025, each community college, in consultation  
16 with students and student organizations, shall develop and implement a plan to provide  
17 students with access to **ALL METHODS OF** over-the-counter contraception.

20 (i) The student health center;

21 (ii) Retail establishments on campus;

22 (iii) Vending machines; or

(iv) Any other method that provides all students access when on campus.

25 (c) [(1) On or before September 1, 2025, and each September 1 thereafter, on a  
26 form provided by the Commission, each community college shall submit a report to the  
27 Commission on implementation of the plan required under this section, including:

28 (i) How students are provided access to over-the-counter  
29 contraception on campus;

30 (ii) Available information regarding the amount of over-the-counter  
31 contraception provided on campus; and

(iii) A description of how the community college has consulted with students and student organizations to develop and implement the plan under this section.

(d)] The Maryland Department of Health, on request, may provide assistance to a community college in:

9 (1) Developing a plan under this section; and

10 (2) Consulting and collaborating with organizations with expertise in  
11 providing access to over-the-counter contraception through vending machines.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
13 1, 2026.
