A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners – Appointment Process –**
3 **Alterations**

4 FOR the purpose of repealing provisions of law related to the Baltimore City Public School
5 Board Community Panel; altering the process for appointments to the Baltimore City
6 Board of School Commissioners; and generally relating to appointments for the
7 Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

10 Section 3–108.1

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Education**

16 3–108.1.

17 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

18 (2) “Board” means the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners of
19 the Baltimore City Public School System.

20 (3) “Mayor” means the Mayor of Baltimore City.

21 (4) “Panel” means the Baltimore City Public School Board Community

22 Panel.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

1 (b) (1) There is a Baltimore City Public School Board Community Panel.

2 (2) The purpose of the panel is to select nominees to be recommended to
3 the Mayor as qualified candidates for appointment to the board.

4 (3) The Mayor shall convene the panel.

5 (4) The panel may include a representative from each of the following
6 organizations, appointed by the organization:

7 (i) The Baltimore Teachers Union;

8 (ii) The Mayor's Office;

9 (iii) The Baltimore City Council Education and Youth Committee;

10 (iv) The Baltimore City Public School Administrators and
11 Supervisors Association;

12 (v) The Maryland Alliance of Public Charter Schools;

13 (vi) The Downtown Baltimore Family Alliance;

14 (vii) The Fund for Educational Excellence;

15 (viii) A parent member of the PTA Council of Baltimore City;

16 (ix) The American Federation of State, County, and Municipal
17 Employees (AFSCME);

18 (x) The Associated Student Congress of Baltimore City;

19 (xi) The American Civil Liberties Union;

20 (xii) The Parent and Community Advisory Board; and

21 (xiii) Disability Rights Maryland.

22 (5) The Mayor may reconvene the panel if the Mayor elects not to appoint
23 a member from the list submitted by the panel under subsection (d)(1)(i) or (i)(6) of this
24 section.]

25 [(c)] (B) There is a Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners of the
26 Baltimore City Public School System.

27 [(d)] (C) [(1)] The board consists of:

8 [(2) If the Mayor elects not to appoint a member from a list submitted by
9 the panel under paragraph (1)(i) of this subsection, the Mayor shall reconvene the panel to
10 submit additional names of qualified candidates.]

11 [(e)] (D) Each member of the board shall be a resident of Baltimore City.

12 **[f] (E)** The two elected voting members shall be elected at large by the voters
13 of Baltimore City.

14 [g] (F) To the extent practicable, the appointed members of the board shall
15 reflect the demographic composition of Baltimore City.

16 [h] (G) (1) At least four of the appointed voting members shall possess a
17 high level of knowledge and expertise concerning the successful administration of a large
18 business, nonprofit, or governmental entity and shall have served in a high level
19 management position within such an entity.

20 (2) At least three of the appointed voting members shall possess a high
21 level of knowledge and expertise concerning education.

22 (3) At least one appointed voting member shall be a parent of a student
23 enrolled in the Baltimore City Public School System as of the date of appointment of the
24 member.

25 (4) (i) Among the appointed voting members, at least one member shall
26 also possess knowledge or experience in the education of children with disabilities.

27 (ii) The knowledge or experience may be derived from being the
28 parent of a child with a disability.

29 [(i)] (H) (1) (i) The term of an appointed voting member is 3 years.

30 (ii) The term of an elected member is 4 years.

(3) At the end of a term, a voting member continues to serve until a successor is elected or appointed and qualifies.

5 (4) A voting member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only
6 for the remainder of the term and until a successor is elected or appointed and qualifies.

7 (5) A voting member may not serve more than two consecutive full terms.

13 (ii) If the Mayor elects not to appoint a member from a list submitted
14 by the panel under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, the Mayor shall reconvene the panel
15 to submit additional names of qualified candidates].

16 (7) The elected members of the board shall be elected:

17 (i) At the general election in November 2022 and every 4 years
18 thereafter; and

19 (ii) In accordance with Title 8, Subtitle 8 of the Election Law Article.

[j] (I) (1) On the approval of the Mayor, an appointed member may be removed only for cause in accordance with § 3-108 of this subtitle.

22 (2) The State Board may remove an elected voting member for:

23 (i) Immorality;

24 (ii) Misconduct in office;

25 (iii) Incompetency; or

26 (iv) Willful neglect of duty.

27 [(k)] (j) Each member of the board serves without compensation.

28 **(l) (K)** Beginning on July 1, 1999, and every 2 years thereafter, from among
29 its voting members the board shall elect a chairman.

1 **[(m)] (L)** (1) The student member shall be a student regularly enrolled in the
2 student's junior or senior year of high school in the Baltimore City Public School System
3 who shall be elected by the high school students of the Baltimore City Public School System,
4 in accordance with procedures established by the board in collaboration with the Associated
5 Student Congress of Baltimore City.

6 (2) The term of a student member is 1 year.

7 (3) A student member may not serve more than two consecutive full terms.

8 (4) The student member may vote on matters before the board, including
9 those relating to:

10 (i) Capital and operating budgets;

11 (ii) School closings, reopenings, and boundaries; and

12 (iii) Student disciplinary matters.

13 (5) The student member may not vote on matters before the board relating
14 to personnel and collective bargaining decisions.

15 (6) The student member may attend or participate in an executive or
16 special session of the board.

17 **[(n)] (M)** Any action by the board shall require:

18 (1) A quorum of a majority of the voting members then serving; and

19 (2) The affirmative vote of a majority of the voting members then serving.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the requirement that
21 appointed members of and members appointed to fill a vacancy on the Baltimore City Board
22 of School Commissioners be appointed subject to confirmation by the Senate of Maryland
23 in accordance with § 3-108.1 of the Education Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act,
24 shall apply to appointed members and members appointed to fill a vacancy after the
25 effective date of this Act.

26 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
27 1, 2026.
