## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

### **State Government – Walk-In Service Requirements**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain State divisions and programs to provide walk-in  
4 service to the public on a first-come, first-served basis at a reasonable frequency  
5 and at reasonable locations; and generally relating to walk-in service requirements.

6 BY adding to

7 Article – State Government

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### **Article – State Government**

14 **10-1703.**

15 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO THE FOLLOWING STATE DIVISIONS AND  
16 PROGRAMS THAT PROVIDE SERVICES DIRECTLY TO THE PUBLIC:

17 (1) THE DEPARTMENT OF AGING, DURABLE AND MEDICAL  
18 EQUIPMENT RE-USE PROGRAM;

19 (2) THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, MARYLAND BUSINESS  
20 EXPRESS PROGRAM;

23 (1) AT A REASONABLE FREQUENCY, BUT NOT LESS THAN 1 DAY PER  
24 WEEK BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 10:00 A.M. AND 4:00 P.M.: AND

25 (2) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, AT REASONABLE  
26 LOCATIONS.

27 (C) (1) A DIVISION OR PROGRAM LISTED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS  
28 SECTION THAT REGULARLY PROVIDES IN-PERSON APPOINTMENTS TO THE PUBLIC  
29 SHALL PROVIDE WALK-IN SERVICE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS  
30 SECTION AT EACH LOCATION WHERE IN-PERSON APPOINTMENTS ARE HELD.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
6 October 1, 2026.
