1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and Maryland Advisory Council on Deaf**
3 **and Hard of Hearing – Renaming**

4 FOR the purpose of renaming the Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing to be the Office
5 of the Deaf, Deafblind, and Hard of Hearing; renaming the Maryland Advisory
6 Council on Deaf and Hard of Hearing to be the Maryland Advisory Council on Deaf,
7 Deafblind, and Hard of Hearing; and generally relating to renaming the Office of the
8 Deaf and Hard of Hearing and the Maryland Advisory Council on Deaf and Hard of
9 Hearing.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – Education**

4 23–109.

5 (b) The Deaf Culture Digital Library shall:

6 (1) Conduct a needs assessment to identify gaps in library services for deaf
7 patrons and to implement strategies to fill the gaps and better coordinate library services
8 for the deaf;

9 (2) In coordination with the Governor’s Office of the Deaf, **DEAFBLIND**,
10 and Hard of Hearing, develop and provide sensitivity training for State and county library
11 staff to help them better understand deaf patrons and their needs;

12 (3) Develop a website that will allow for information sharing and
13 coordination between the Deaf Culture Digital Library and county library systems;

14 (4) In coordination with the State Library Agency, develop deaf–related
15 programs and materials and share them with county library systems and other libraries in
16 the State;

17 (5) Develop partnerships and strategic alliances with other entities,
18 including:

19 (i) The Governor’s Office of the Deaf, **DEAFBLIND**, and Hard of
20 Hearing;

21 (ii) County library systems;

22 (iii) The State Library Agency;

23 (iv) Veterans’ groups;

24 (v) State and local arts councils;

25 (vi) Senior citizens organizations; and

26 (vii) Deaf and hard of hearing organizations, including:

27 1. The National Association of the Deaf;

28 2. The Hearing Loss Association of America; and

29 3. The Maryland Association of the Deaf;

1 (6) Encourage partnerships and collaborations with information service
2 providers to help provide virtual access to information and research;

3 (7) Form a Deaf Culture Digital Library Advisory Board to provide advice
4 on initiatives that further advance the mission and goals of the Deaf Culture Digital
5 Library and the majority of whose members are deaf or hard of hearing and selected from
6 the following entities:

7 (i) County library systems;

8 (ii) The State Library Agency;

9 (iii) The Governor's Office of the Deaf, **DEAFBLIND**, and Hard of
10 Hearing;

11 (iv) Statewide deaf and hard of hearing organizations; and

12 (v) Other organizations as agreed on by the Governor's Office of the
13 Deaf, **DEAFBLIND**, and Hard of Hearing and the State Library Agency; and

14 (8) Establish a Deaf Culture Digital Library "Friends of the Library" group
15 composed of individuals who are strongly committed, well-positioned, and able to promote
16 community involvement, advocacy, and funding for the Deaf Culture Digital Library.

21 (a) (1) The Council consists of the following members:

22 (xiii) The [Executive] Director of the Governor's Office of the Deaf,

25 (a) There is an Early Hearing Detection and Intervention Advisory Council for
26 the Program.

27 (b) (2) Of the 12 members:

28 (ix) 1 shall be from the Governor's Office of the Deaf, **DEAFBLIND**,

15 and Hard of Hearing.

17 (e) The Department shall administer, supervise, and coordinate the Program
18 with the cooperation of the Department of Disabilities, the Department of Human Services,
19 the Governor’s Office of the Deaf, **DEAFBLIND**, and Hard of Hearing, and the Maryland

8 (c) The Advisory Group shall include:

9 (2) the Director of the Office of the Deaf, **DEAFBLIND**, and Hard of
10 Hearing, or the Director’s designee;

13 An individual shall have immediate vesting rights on taking office in the State
14 system in which the individual is a member if the individual is the:

15 (10) Director of the Office of the Deaf, **DEAFBLIND**, and Hard of Hearing;

18 (b) There is a State Coordinating Committee for Health and Human Services
19 Transportation.

20 (c) The Committee consists of the following members:

21 (10) The Director of the [Governor’s] Office [for] **OF** the Deaf, **DEAFBLIND**,
22 and Hard of Hearing, or the Director’s designee;

23 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED**, That, as provided in this Act:

24 (a) The Office of the Deaf, Deafblind, and Hard of Hearing is the successor of the
25 Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

26 (b) In every law, executive order, rule, regulation, policy, or document created by
27 an official, an employee, or a unit of this State, the names and titles of those agencies and
28 officials mean the names and titles of the successor agency or official.

1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That nothing in this Act affects the
2 term of office of an appointed or elected member of any commission, office, department,
3 agency, or other unit. An individual who is a member of a unit on the effective date of this
4 Act shall remain for the balance of the term to which appointed or elected, unless the
5 member sooner dies, resigns, or is removed under provisions of law.

6 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any transaction or
7 employment status affected by or flowing from any change of nomenclature or any statute
8 amended by this Act and validly entered into or existing before the effective date of this Act
9 and every right, duty, or interest flowing from a statute amended by this Act remains valid
10 after the effective date of this Act and may be terminated, completed, consummated, or
11 enforced as required or allowed by any statute amended by this Act as though the
12 amendment had not occurred. If a change in nomenclature involves a change in name or
13 designation of any State unit, the successor unit shall be considered in all respects as
14 having the powers and obligations granted the former unit.

15 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

16 (a) The continuity of every commission, office, department, agency, or other unit
17 is retained.

18 (b) The personnel, records, files, furniture, fixtures, and other properties and all
19 appropriations, credits, assets, liabilities, and obligations of each retained unit are
20 continued as the personnel, records, files, furniture, fixtures, properties, appropriations,
21 credits, assets, liabilities, and obligations of the unit under the laws enacted by this Act.

22 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That letterhead, business cards,
23 and other documents reflecting the renaming of the Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing
24 to be the Office of the Deaf, Deafblind, and Hard of Hearing may not be used until all
25 letterhead, business cards, and other documents already in print and reflecting the name
26 of the Office before the effective date of this Act have been used.

27 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publisher of the
28 Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the
29 Department of Legislative Services, shall correct, with no further action required by the
30 General Assembly, cross-references and terminology rendered incorrect by this Act. The
31 publisher shall adequately describe any correction that is made in an editor's note following
32 the section affected.

33 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
34 October 1, 2026.
