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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Retirement and Pension System – ~~Eligible Governmental Units~~**  
3 **Administration and Clarification**

4 FOR the purpose of clarifying that an eligible governmental unit of the Employees' Pension  
5 System, the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System, and the Correctional  
6 Officers' Retirement System that satisfies certain requirements is eligible to  
7 participate in a certain system of the State Retirement and Pension System only if  
8 all employees of the eligible governmental unit participate in the certain system;  
9 clarifying that certain documentation by an eligible governmental unit electing to  
10 participate in the Employees' Pension System, the Law Enforcement Officers'  
11 Pension System, or the Correctional Officers' Retirement System shall include  
12 certain properly completed election forms; and generally relating to participating  
13 governmental units in the State Retirement and Pension System.

5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
6 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7 **Article – State Personnel and Pensions**

8 21-309.1.

9 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

10 (2) “Local employee” has the meaning stated in § 21-304 of this subtitle.

11 (3) “Local employer” has the meaning stated in § 21-304 of this subtitle.

12 (b) On or before December 1 of each year, the Board of Trustees shall determine  
13 and certify the amounts payable by each local employer under § 21-304(b)(4) of this subtitle  
14 for the next fiscal year.

15 (c) On or before October 1, January 1, [April 1] APRIL 16, and June 1 of each  
16 fiscal year, each local employer shall pay to the Board of Trustees 25% of the amount of the  
17 charges certified to the local employer by the Board of Trustees under subsection (b) of this  
18 section.

19 (d) (1) The Secretary of the Board of Trustees may allow a grace period not to  
20 exceed 10 calendar days for payment of the amounts certified under this section.

21 (2) If a local employer does not pay the amounts required under this section  
22 within the time required, on notification by the Secretary of the Board of Trustees that a  
23 delinquency exists, the State Comptroller immediately:

24 (i) shall withhold the delinquent amounts, including interest on the  
25 delinquent amounts at a rate of 7.75% a year, from any installment due the local employer  
26 from the General State School Fund; and

27 (ii) shall pay to the Board of Trustees the delinquent amounts,  
28 including interest, withheld under this paragraph.

29 (e) On receipt of the payments from each local employer or the State Comptroller,  
30 the Board of Trustees shall credit these amounts to the accumulation fund of the  
31 appropriate State system.

1       (a) For purposes of making determinations under this section, the Teachers'  
2 Pension System and the Teachers' Retirement System shall be considered together as one  
3 State system.

4       (b) (1) For fiscal year 2026, each county government shall pay to the Board of  
5 Trustees on or before January 1, 2026, the amount specified for that county government  
6 under § 21-304(b)(6) of this subtitle.

7       (2) Beginning in fiscal year 2027, each county government shall pay to the  
8 Board of Trustees on or before each September 1 the amount specified for that county  
9 government under § 21-304(b)(6) of this subtitle.

10       (c) (1) The Secretary of the Board of Trustees may allow a grace period not to  
11 exceed 10 calendar days for payment of the amounts certified under this section.

12       (2) If a county government does not pay the amounts required under this  
13 section within the time required, on notification by the Secretary of the Board of Trustees  
14 that a delinquency exists, the State Comptroller immediately shall:

15               (i) exercise the right of setoff against any money due or coming due  
16 to the delinquent county government; and

17               (ii) pay to the Board of Trustees the delinquent amounts, including  
18 interest ON THE DELINQUENT AMOUNTS AT A RATE OF 7.75% A YEAR, withheld in  
19 accordance with this paragraph.

20       (d) On receipt of the payments from each county government or the State  
21 Comptroller, the Board of Trustees shall credit the amounts received to the accumulation  
22 funds of the Teachers' Pension System and the Teachers' Retirement System.

24       (a) (1) Membership in the Employees' Pension System is optional for an  
25 individual who is:

26               (i) an official, elected or appointed for a fixed term;

27               (ii) an employee of the Governor's office;

28               (iii) an employee of the Senate or House of Delegates;

29               (iv) a member of the Prince George's County Board of License  
30 Commissioners;

31               (v) an employee of Dorchester County who is not and has not  
32 previously been a member of the county's general pension and retirement program or any  
33 other plan sponsored by Dorchester County; or

1           (vi) except as provided in subsection (g) of this section, an employee  
2 of a participating governmental unit who is employed by the participating governmental  
3 unit before the effective date of participation and who remains an employee of the  
4 participating governmental unit through the effective date of participation.

5           (2) An individual described under paragraph (1)(i) through (v) of this  
6 subsection who elects to join the Employees' Pension System shall make the election at  
7 commencement of employment by filing a written application with the Board of Trustees

10 elects to join the Employees' Pension System shall make the election prior to the effective  
11 date of participation by filing a written application with the Board of Trustees on a form  
12 that the Board of Trustees provides.

13           (4) An election to join the Employees' Pension System under this  
14 subsection is a one-time, irrevocable election.

31 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

32 (d) "Eligible governmental unit" means a governmental unit that is eligible to  
33 participate in the employees' systems under § 31-102 of this subtitle.

22 (a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of an eligible  
23 governmental unit may approve participation by its employees in the Employees’ Pension  
24 System if:

25 (1) the legislative body adopts a resolution in the form prescribed by the  
26 Board of Trustees; and

27 (2) the eligible governmental unit operates a local plan, only if:

1 (i) at least 60% of the members of the local plan petition to become  
2 members of the Employees' Pension System;

3 (ii) the eligible governmental unit satisfies the requirements in  
4 subsection (b) of this section; and

5 (iii) the legislative body approves participation of the eligible  
6 governmental unit in the Employees' Pension System as though the local plan were not in  
7 operation.

8 (b) An eligible governmental unit that operates a local plan may approve  
9 participation by its employees in the Employees' Pension System only if:

10 (1) the local plan of the eligible governmental unit requires member  
11 contributions at the same rate as the member contribution rate that would be applicable to  
12 employees of the eligible governmental unit in the Employees' Pension System; or

13 (2) the eligible governmental unit:

14 (i) does not provide for the employer pickup of member  
15 contributions to the local plan within the meaning of § 414(h)(2) of the Internal Revenue  
16 Code; and

17 (ii) certifies that it will not become an approved employer under §  
18 21-313 of this article on or after the effective date of participation.

19 (c) (1) If an eligible governmental unit does not satisfy the requirements  
20 under subsection (b) of this section, the eligible governmental unit may submit a request to  
21 the Board of Trustees to participate in the Employees' Pension System.

22 (2) The Board of Trustees shall consider a request made under paragraph  
23 (1) of this subsection and determine whether any legislation is necessary to allow the  
24 eligible governmental unit to participate in the Employees' Pension System.

25 (3) The Board of Trustees shall make recommendations to the Joint  
26 Committee on Pensions regarding any legislation that it determines is necessary to allow  
27 the eligible governmental unit to participate in the Employees' Pension System.

11 participating governmental unit joins the Employees' Pension System on the effective date,  
12 the employee [is entitled to] SHALL RECEIVE 100% service credit for THE EMPLOYEE'S  
13 employment with the participating governmental unit before the effective date.

14            (b) If an employee of the Baltimore Metropolitan Council elects to become a  
15 member of the Employees' Retirement System or the Employees' Pension System, the  
16 employee may not receive credit for service from July 1, 1992, to the effective date unless  
17 the employee pays to the Board of Trustees the amount of the member contributions the  
18 employee would have made during that period, plus regular interest.

25            Subject to § 31-2A-03 of this subtitle, the governmental units that are eligible to  
26 participate in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System are:

28            (2) municipal corporations.

30            (a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section, the legislative body of an eligible  
31 governmental unit may approve participation by its law enforcement officers, firefighters,  
32 or emergency medical technicians in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System if:

2 Board of Trustees; and

3 (2) the eligible governmental unit participates in a State system or  
4 operates a local plan, only if:

5 (i) at least 60% of the law enforcement officers, firefighters, or  
6 emergency medical technicians of the eligible governmental unit petition to become

8 (ii) the eligible governmental unit satisfies the requirements in

19 of the eligible governmental unit in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; or
