25 (B) THE UNIT MAY ~~IMPLEMENT PROACTIVE STEPS TO ADDRESS AND~~

~~(2) FOR EACH FINDING, THE DASHBOARD SHALL INCLUDE:~~

(A) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE UNIT SHALL SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE JOINT AUDIT AND EVALUATION COMMITTEE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON ALL AUDIT FINDINGS FOR EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENTAL UNITS UNDER EXAMINATION.

(B) THE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION FOR EACH FINDING:

~~(i)~~ (1) THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE AUDITS;

~~(ii)~~ (2) THE NUMBER OF YEARS THAT A REPEAT FINDING REMAINS UNRESOLVED;

~~(iii)~~ (3) THE PROJECTED COMPLETION DATE OF THE RESOLUTION;

~~(iv)~~ (4) INFORMATION ON UNRESOLVED FINDINGS, INCLUDING THE REASON A FINDING IS UNRESOLVED; AND

~~(v)~~ (5) A GRAPHIC REPRESENTATION OF THE PROGRESS OF CORRECTIVE ACTIONS THAT INCLUDES WHETHER THE FINDING IS UNRESOLVED, IN PROGRESS, OR RESOLVED.

(h) (1) The Governor and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Maryland shall implement systems and processes to monitor the efforts of the Executive

1 Departmental Units and the Judiciary, respectively, to correct audit findings reported by
2 the Office of Legislative Audits.

3 (i) **(1)** A report auditing a unit of State or local government shall have any
4 cybersecurity findings redacted in a manner consistent with auditing best practices before
5 the report is made available to the public.

6 **(2)** AN UNREDACTED CYBERSECURITY FINDING IN A REPORT
7 AUDITING A UNIT OF STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT MAY BE VIEWED BY:

8 (I) MEMBERS OF THE JOINT AUDIT AND EVALUATION
9 COMMITTEE;

10 (II) MEMBERS OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON CYBERSECURITY,
11 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, AND BIOTECHNOLOGY;

12 (III) THE CHAIR AND THE SUBCOMMITTEE CHAIRS OF THE
13 SENATE BUDGET AND TAXATION COMMITTEE;

14 (IV) THE CHAIR AND THE SUBCOMMITTEE CHAIRS OF THE
15 HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE;

16 (V) THE GOVERNOR, THE GOVERNOR'S CHIEF OF STAFF, AND
17 THE GOVERNOR'S DEPUTY CHIEFS OF STAFF; AND

18 (VI) THE AUDIT AND FINANCE COMPLIANCE UNIT IN THE
19 DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT.
