SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That ~~the Laws of Maryland read as follows:~~

~~(a) In this Division I of this article the following words have the meanings indicated.~~

~~(f) Unless expressly provided otherwise, “Department” means the Department of Budget and Management.~~

~~(j) “Position” means an employment assignment of duties and responsibilities that requires the full-time employment of one individual or less than full-time employment of one or more individuals.~~

~~7-701.~~

~~(a) **[In] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 7-702 OF THIS SUBTITLE, IN this [title] SUBTITLE,** “part-time employee” means an employee who works an average of 50% or more but less than 100% of the regular workweek.~~

~~(b) An individual who is a full-time employee who is qualified for or desires to be a full-time employee may not be required to accept part-time employment as a condition of continued or new State employment.~~

~~(e) An individual who is a part-time employee who is qualified for or desires to be a part-time employee may not be required to accept full-time employment as a condition of continued or new State employment.~~

~~(d) (1) In accordance with regulations adopted by the Secretary, a part-time employee is entitled to receive all employment rights, privileges, and benefits that are normally available to a full-time employee in a similar position with a similar grade and length of service.~~

15 ~~(I) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1 AND DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, BEGINNING~~

17 ~~GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT~~

19 ~~(1) THE STATUS OF THE ELIGIBILITY DETERMINATIONS BY EACH~~

23 (a) There is a Workgroup for an Inclusive State Workplace.

24 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:

25 (1) the Secretary of Budget and Management, or the Secretary's designee;

26 (2) the Comptroller, or the Comptroller's designee;

27 (3) the Secretary of Information Technology, or the Secretary's designee;

28 (4) the Secretary of Commerce, or the Secretary's designee;

29 (5) the Secretary of Aging, or the Secretary's designee;

1 (6) the Executive Director of the Maryland Commission for Women, or the
2 Executive Director's designee;

3 (7) the Secretary of Health, or the Secretary's designee;

4 (8) the Secretary of Disabilities, or the Secretary's designee;

5 (9) the Secretary of Transportation, or the Secretary's designee;

6 (10) the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland, or the
7 Chancellor's designee;

8 (11) one representative from a State employees union, appointed by the
9 Governor;

10 (12) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of
11 the Senate;

12 (13) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the
13 House; and

14 (14) any representative appointed by the Governor under subsection (c) of
15 this section.

16 (c) The Governor may appoint the following members to the Workgroup:

17 (1) a representative who is actively engaged in the caregiving community;

18 (2) a representative who is actively engaged in the disabilities community;

19 (3) a representative who is actively engaged in the healthcare community;

20 (4) a representative who is actively engaged in the older adult community;

21 and

22 (5) an economist with expertise in labor economics.

23 (d) The Governor shall designate the chair of the Workgroup.

24 (e) The Department of Budget and Management shall provide staff for the
25 Workgroup.

26 (f) A member of the Workgroup:

27 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but

1 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State
2 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

3 (g) (1) The Workgroup shall begin meeting before October 1, 2026.

4 (2) The Workgroup shall:

5 (i) outline the steps the State needs to take to encourage the
6 expansion of part-time employment within the State Personnel Management System, the
7 University System of Maryland, and the Department of Transportation;

8 (ii) focus on the inclusive employment opportunities in State
9 government and removing obstacles for individuals challenged by full-time employment;

10 (iii) review the current policies and procedures concerning part-time
11 employment in State government;

12 (iv) analyze the budgetary incentives, recruitment best practices,
13 and support structures currently in place to encourage hiring of part-time, benefit-eligible
14 employees;

15 (v) study the economic and operational effects and quantify the
16 long-term economic benefits of part-time employment on households and State
17 government;

18 (vi) suggest timelines and identify methods and associated metrics
19 for expanding part-time employment opportunities; and

20 (vii) identify any potential statutory changes required to implement
21 the steps identified by the Workgroup.

22 (h) On or before September 15, 2027, the Workgroup shall provide its findings
23 and recommendations in a report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2-1257 of
24 the State Government Article.

25 (i) On or before December 31, 2027, the Department of Budget and Management
26 shall develop and distribute guidance to State agencies on expanding part-time
27 employment opportunities, taking into consideration the findings and recommendations of
28 the Workgroup.

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
30 1, 2026. It shall remain effective for a period of ~~2~~ 2 years and, at the end of June 30, ~~2029~~
31 2028, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated
32 and of no further force and effect.
