<p>B-360 utilizes dirt bike culture to end the cycle of poverty, disrupt the prison pipeline, and build bridges in communities. Through education, community engagement, career preparation, and events, we equip youth and young adults with the skills to secure educational and career opportunities. Since 2017, we have served 11K+ youth/young adults and employed/pipelined 70+ justice-involved participants, achieving significant success and impact. 92% of participants are interested in or pursuing STEM careers. Standardized test scores increased by 41 points 100% diversion rate among participants 0% recidivism among internally hired diversion youth Baltimore City experienced an 87% decrease in crime \$6.2M taxes saved by redirecting participant into our programming</p>		

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Carving a new lane to careers and opportunities one wheelie at a time, B-360 transitions youth and young adults in Baltimore out of traffic into programming, building a safe space to grow transferable skills, increasing economic justice, disrupting the prison pipeline and helping add sustainability in our community. The #Ride4Change campaign to build a campus complete with a safety riding track, classrooms, office space, and mechanic shop. Through culturally relevant programming we teach students the engineering design process and create safe spaces to apply engineering and rider safety. We also foster new pipelines to STEM careers and workforce development for young adults seeking an alternative to the criminal justice system. With this funding we will solidify our impact in Baltimore by building a multi-use facility and regional hub for our style of riding, to host events and provide needed transferable skills for in demand careers.
