28. Comments

We have collected many artifacts, some very old, and some reflecting 20th century life. We have also collected many documents including newspaper articles about Elkridge and its people, obituaries, photographs, oral histories, memorabilia for area sports and other activities etc. We also maintain Dr. Brumbaugh's office and waiting room.

Over the years, we had various displays in the house for our membership to view when they came to meetings, but in September 2025, we opened a more professional museum experience, open to the public for free every third Saturday of the month, and also offer private tours by request. With the help of Howard County grants and Preservation Maryland we have begun renovating the inside, with the first floor completed beautifully for our open house, also installing Air Conditioning and remote thermostats to protect our collection.

We continue to take in donations of artifacts, having recently received beautiful original artwork that was used by us in the past to make custom commemorative plates for sale, a collection of signed baseballs, yearbooks, and other school memorabilia. As the heritage of Elkridge shifts, we strive to collect things from the recent past as well as older things because history is in the making and our heritage is morphing.

Our curator has worked hard to keep up with a catalog of our collection, and bit by bit we are trying to digitize it and have added an Elkridge Knowledge Base to our website, www.elkridgeheritage.org.
