Parks & People is a nonprofit working in Baltimore City to spark wonder through play, education, and nature. Founded in 1984, the organization has a history of investment in Baltimore's public spaces through a community lens. Parks & People works with stakeholders to implement greenspace projects for the benefit of Baltimore City.		

**11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)**

In 1962, developers built a shopping complex on top of Laurel Cemetery, Baltimores first nondenominational cemetery for African Americans. Laurel Cemetery was a resting place for thousands of African Americans, including veterans, community leaders, and everyday citizens who helped shape the city's history. Research has determined only about 600 of 25,000 graves were relocated before construction. Parks & People will assist Coppin State University in an effort to design and erect a monument on two acres of green space to acknowledge the community's loss, educate the public about the site's significance, and serve as a powerful act of remembrance and justice. Funding for this project will ensure that this long-overdue recognition of Laurel Cemetery's legacy becomes a reality before the opportunity for coordinated community and institutional action passes.
