We are a community-centered organization launching a barber school dedicated to training aspiring barbers. Our purpose is twofold: first, to equip individuals including youth with a valuable trade that leads to employment opportunities, and second, to foster community engagement.</p> <p>11. continued- The school will create a structured pathway for youth and adults, particularly those from underserved communities, to obtain state licensure, industry certifications, and job placement opportunities. In addition to technical training, the program will incorporate entrepreneurship education, financial literacy, and professional development to prepare graduates for sustainable careers, whether as employees or small business owners.</p> <p>Beyond workforce development, the project will serve as a safe, positive community hub that promotes mentorship, character development, and economic empowerment. By investing in skilled trades and small business creation, this initiative will strengthen local economic growth, reduce barriers to employment, and contribute to long-term community stability and self-sufficiency.</p>
