Military/first responders are eligible for membership discounts' sponsors a swim team giving children an opportunity to swim competitively in the Prince-Mont Swim League; sponsors open houses, hosts day camps & offers swim lessons. In addition, we are the training summer home of the DC Synchronmasters, who compete Nationally/Globally. Several Boy Scout Troops use OHRC to earn swimming/lifesaving/camping/volunteer badges. OHRC hosts family-style gatherings (birthdays, graduations, campouts, movie nights, etc.) with the public welcome as member guests</p>		

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Oxon Hill Recreation Swim Club (OHRC) Board of Directors is seeking funds to renovate its 72-year-old swimming pool facility. With the requested 2026 funds, our immediate priorities are to resurface the Olympic pool making it ADH accessible; install holding tanks to temporarily contain pool water backwash; repair/replace non-functional underwater pool lights/upgrade associated electrical wiring and electrical panel; resurface pool deck and roof repair. Also repair leak/re-plaster in/out take valve of baby/wade pool. Upgrade/refurbish bathrooms for ADH accessibility. OHRC would also acquire an AED defibrillator. No new construction is planned with the funds. The renovations will not change the pool size.
