We are seeking funds for the Sawyer-Durant Legacy Center to complete the planning, design, and site improvement necessary to construct the proposed project. The facility will be built to occupy a complete (two-story) facility that uses purposed 4200 sq ft. The facility will have three areas dedicated to education spaces with computer stations, and an open 2300 sq ft. for community usage, training, and social activities. This project will provide services in the community in conjunction with Harvest Inc. by also providing food, clothing, and resources to combat the dwindling economic downfall of the community. Also, it will provide an emergency shelter for those in need. The service offered is essential to the community in multiple aspects, particularly for our veterans. We will also extend our services to the general population, regardless of nationality, race, or religion.

The center plans to provide healthy meals to the veterans and seniors registered 3x a month on Wednesdays for in-house consumption. They will be food distribution 2x a month for veterans and seniors to take to their prospective homes.

We plan to have interfaith gatherings to collaborate with local faith groups and governmental associations to help better the lives of those we serve. The Legacy Center plans to coordinate one to two monthly social outings for veterans and seniors who register as availability allows.

We are excited to announce our vision for a vibrant community during the expansion phase of our newly proposed project, which aims to enhance and build upon the programs and services we currently provide.

The acquisition of this pivotal LBI grant is crucial for us to kickstart the preliminary construction phase of our project. Once operational, the facility will be open daily from 9 AM to 4 PM, offering invaluable resources to those in need. Members of the Legacy Center Program will gain access to our computer lab, recreational area, and resource center, ensuring they have the tools necessary to thrive. Additionally, we will allocate extra space based on reservation needs.

Our unwavering commitment is to provide healthy meals to registered veterans and seniors three times a month on Wednesdays, ensuring they enjoy nutritious food in a welcoming environment. Furthermore, we will organize food distribution and health care evaluations twice a month.
