<b>10. Description and Purpose of Organization</b> (Limit length to visible area)		
<p>The grantee organization is the County Executive and County Council of Baltimore County. Specifically, these funds would support the Baltimore County Department of Aging (BCDA). BCDAs mission is to strengthen lives by providing services, programs, and connections to resources for Baltimore County older adults and their families. BCDA supports clients across the continuum of aging, helping them age safely, with dignity, and as much independence as possible. Clients can receive home-delivered meals, participate in congregate meals, access resources through the Maryland Access Point, or receive needed home care supplies to support their ability to remain in the community. BCDA also owns and operates 21 Senior Centers, 20 of which are physical locations and one is a virtual Senior Center. Senior Centers offer a variety of programs and opportunities.</p>		

**11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)**

The purpose of this project is to upgrade the electrical and security infrastructure at four Senior Centers: Overlea-Fullerton Senior Center, Parkville Senior Center, Seven Oaks Senior Center, and Victory Villa Senior Center. By modernizing electrical systems, enhancing security features, and installing key card access, this project will ensure that each Center is equipped to safely and reliably deliver 21st century programming. Keycard access is especially important in Senior Centers, where staff must balance openness and community engagement with the need to maintain a safe, well-managed environment for members and staff. Controlled entry systems help prevent unauthorized access, reduce the risk of intrusion, and allow staff to respond quickly in emergencies. These improvements will support the growing population of older adults in District 8 and strengthen the Centers ability to provide safe, accessible, and future-ready community spaces.
