10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)		
At SpringForward Ventures we are creating people-first workplaces that recognize every individuals value and potential, including through our indoor hydroponic farm, where meaningful employment and skill-building happen in a controlled, innovative environment. Our purpose is to design work settings that support economic stability, dignity, and long-term opportunity particularly for adults with behavioral wellness needs. Grounded in real-world practice, we advance inclusive and adaptable employment models that promote shared prosperity. By reimagining how work is structured and supported, we help people thrive while building equitable, sustainable, and just organizations.		

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

SpringForward Farms is a commercial indoor hydroponic farming enterprise operated by SpringForward Ventures that integrates workforce development with sustainable urban agriculture. Its purpose is to operate a viable, revenue-generating business while preparing individuals particularly those with mental health wellness needs and barriers to employment for long-term success in the controlled-environment agriculture sector. The farm develops and delivers a structured training curriculum, including manager-led instruction and industry-recognized certifications, to recruit and train 40 participants in hydroponic farm operations. Participants gain hands-on experience alongside a trained project manager and agricultural experts, building technical, operational, and employability skills while supporting sustained greenhouse operations and pathways to meaningful employment.

<p>SpringForward received a MD CDS grant of \$307,000 from then Senator Cardin and Senator Van Hollen managed through the DOL to develop controlled agriculture environment (CEA) curriculum and train 40 individuals in indoor agricultural practices. This will occur at this site in addition to permanent employment for the commercial operation. Longer term plans are to also offer apprenticeships in CEA. Note the design expenses, # 12 are a part of this grant funding.</p> <p>Our Annandale VA project has also received funding through the USDA Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production program.</p> <p>* Employees reflect staff from PHILLIPS Programs who have been developing SpringForward. That number is 4 plus consultants. First full year of operation will have 8 full-time employees and 20 trainees through the DOL grant in addition to serving as a practicum site for a Maryland college ag program.</p> <p>SpringForward Farms operates as a commercial controlled-environment agriculture (CEA) business that delivers measurable environmental and community benefits alongside workforce outcomes. Indoor hydroponic production significantly reduces water use, eliminates agricultural runoff, and minimizes land and transportation impacts while enabling year-round growing in an urban setting. By producing fresh, high-quality greens locally, SpringForward Farms shortens supply chains and increases reliable access to nutritious food for nearby communities, including those historically underserved by conventional food systems. Revenue generated through commercial sales supports the long-term sustainability of the operation while reinforcing a model that aligns environmental stewardship, local food access, and inclusive economic opportunity.</p> <p>We have a USDA Local Food Production application pending for marketing but we have engaged a firm and are moving forward with that regardless. We have historical communication with FreshPoint and the sales of microgreens along with a history of selling through our school program. The school program, PHILLIPS School ~ Laurel has 10 years' experience growing hydroponically.</p>
