10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)		
As a vital community organization, the YMCA of the Chesapeake, works side-by-side with our neighbors to address critical community needs. The Y offers critical outreach programs that support individuals at each stage of their development; from early learning development to after-school programming, swim lessons to chronic disease and cancer programming for adults. The YMCA of the Chesapeake has provided continuous service to the community since 1857. Today, we impact the lives of over 50,000 people of all ages, backgrounds, and abilities across the Eastern Shore of Maryland and Virginia throughout eleven YMCA branches. As a not-for-profit community organization, no one is turned away due to the inability to pay. We are committed to providing access and opportunity to every child, adult, and senior living in our communities.

For more than 40 years, the St. Marys County Commissioners, along with hundreds of community leaders, have worked to bring a YMCA to the county, the first in Southern Maryland. That long-held vision is now becoming a reality with the opening of a new 60,000-square-foot YMCA facility scheduled for June 2026. The YMCA of the Chesapeake has a strong track record of serving diverse and rural communities across Maryland's Eastern Shore and beyond, offering programs that remove barriers and support people of all ages and income levels. Located adjacent to Great Mills High School, the \$22 million facility will serve as a transformative hub for health, wellness, and community connection. Designed to meet the evolving needs of Southern Maryland, the YMCA will expand access to critical programs, strengthen individual and family well-being, and foster a healthier, more connected community for generations to come.

The Y will ensure no one is turned away due to the inability to pay by providing financial assistance for membership, programs and services to those that substantiate a need.</p> <p>The YMCA is leading local fundraising efforts with 20+ volunteers to secure \$4,725,000 in private community donations to support the construction of the new YMCA.</p> <p>This project addresses a 40 year community need creating a place that brings people together throughout the community and create an anchor for military stationed at Pax River in the county, contractors supporting Pax River that can play a major role in building community connections that will assist in retaining those brought to the community through Pax River.</p> <p>This public/private partnership model exists in Queen Anne's County where over 7,500 community members enjoy the Y in Centreville, Maryland on a regular basis. Over 30 other not for profits directly benefit from partnerships with the Y and the collective community comes together as one.</p>
