Carroll County Public Schools focuses on excellence by preparing students to be globally competitive, addressing the needs of individual students, maintaining an effective workforce, and ensuring students are educated in safe and orderly environments. The mission of Westminster Elementary School is to provide a nurturing school environment where students are inspired to take risks, problem solve, and respect others. Westminster Elementary School is a Title I public elementary school in Westminster, Maryland serving 550 students in grades pre-k through grade 5.		

**11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

CCPS is requesting a grant to fund an electric school sign for Westminster Elementary School to ensure information sharing and collaboration between school administration, staff, parents, community members, volunteers, and students. The current non-electric outdoor sign is in a state of disrepair - it is outdated, difficult to read, and several components are breaking. The sign can no longer meet the communication needs of our school community. For Westminster Elementary, this need is also an issue of equity and access. As a Title I school, many of our families rely on clear, visible communication. Not all parents have reliable internet access or the flexibility to check email throughout the day. A modern electronic sign ensures equitable communication for every family, providing timely reminders about Title I events, resources, safety messages, and school updates regardless of personal barriers.
