

## Chapter 464

**(Senate Bill 314)**

AN ACT concerning

**Courts – Immunity From Liability – Donation of Pet Supplies**

FOR the purpose of establishing a certain immunity from liability for a person who donates a pet item or dispenses a donated pet item; authorizing the State Department of Agriculture to inspect donated commercial feed and establish procedures for handling donated commercial feed; and generally relating to civil liability and the donation of pet items.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article – Agriculture**

1–101.

(a) In this article the following words have the meanings indicated.

(d) “Department” means the State Department of Agriculture.

(g) “Person” includes the State, any county, municipal corporation or other political subdivision of the State, or any of their units, or an individual, receiver, trustee, guardian, executor, administrator, fiduciary, or representative of any kind, or any

partnership, firm, association, public or private corporation, or any other entity, unless otherwise provided.

6–101.

(a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

(d) “Commercial feed” means a material or combination of materials distributed, or intended for distribution, for use as feed, or for mixing in feed for any animal other than man including feed prepared and distributed for consumption by dogs and cats, or any domesticated animal normally maintained in a cage or tank, including gerbils, hamsters, canaries, psittacine birds, mynahs, finches, tropical fish, goldfish, snakes, and turtles, except:

(1) Unmixed whole seeds and physically altered entire unmixed seeds that are not chemically altered or adulterated;

(2) Commodities such as hay, straw, stover, silage, cobs, husks, hulls, and individual chemical compounds or substances when the commodities, compounds, or substances are not intermixed with other materials or adulterated; or

(3) A material or combination of materials that is exempt from this definition in regulations adopted by the Secretary.

**6–106.1.**

**(A) THE DEPARTMENT MAY:**

**(1) INSPECT FOR WHOLESOMENESS ANY COMMERCIAL FEED DONATED TO A NONPROFIT CORPORATION, ORGANIZATION, OR ASSOCIATION; AND**

**(2) ESTABLISH PROCEDURES FOR HANDLING COMMERCIAL FEED DONATED TO ANY NONPROFIT CORPORATION, ORGANIZATION, OR ASSOCIATION.**

**(B) A PERSON SHALL HAVE THE IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY UNDER § 5–634.1 OF THE COURTS ARTICLE FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION THAT AFFECTS THE NATURE, AGE, CONDITION, OR PACKAGING OF THE DONATED COMMERCIAL FEED.**

#### **Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

**5–634.1.**

**(A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.**

**(2) “PERSON” INCLUDES THE STATE, ANY COUNTY, MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OR OTHER POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE, OR ANY OF THEIR UNITS, OR AN INDIVIDUAL, A RECEIVER, A TRUSTEE, A GUARDIAN, AN EXECUTOR, AN ADMINISTRATOR, A FIDUCIARY, OR A REPRESENTATIVE OF ANY KIND, OR ANY PARTNERSHIP, FIRM, ASSOCIATION, PUBLIC OR PRIVATE CORPORATION, OR OTHER ENTITY.**

**(3) (I) “PET ITEM” MEANS ANY APPARENTLY FIT TANGIBLE PET SUPPLY THAT MEETS ALL QUALITY AND LABELING STANDARDS IMPOSED BY FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS EVEN IF THE ITEM MAY NOT BE READILY MARKETABLE DUE TO APPEARANCE, AGE, FRESHNESS, GRADE, SURPLUS, OR OTHER CONDITION.**

**(II) “PET ITEM” INCLUDES APPARENTLY FIT COMMERCIAL FEED AS DEFINED IN § 6–101 OF THE AGRICULTURE ARTICLE.**

**(B) UNLESS THE ACT OR OMISSION AMOUNTS TO GROSS NEGLIGENCE OR WILLFUL AND WANTON MISCONDUCT, A PERSON IS NOT CIVILLY LIABLE FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION THAT AFFECTS THE NATURE, AGE, CONDITION, OR PACKAGING OF A DONATED PET ITEM IF THE PERSON IN GOOD FAITH:**

**(1) DONATED THE PET ITEM FOR USE OR DISTRIBUTION BY A NONPROFIT CORPORATION, ORGANIZATION, OR ASSOCIATION OR A UNIT OF STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT; OR**

**(2) DISPENSED THE DONATED PET ITEM ON BEHALF OF A NONPROFIT CORPORATION, ORGANIZATION, OR ASSOCIATION OR A UNIT OF STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT.**

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2026.
