Appropriations and Ways and Means

Budget and Taxation

Public Libraries - State Library Resource Center - Funding

This bill increases the per capita funding amount that must be provided to the State Library Resource Center (SLRC) beginning in fiscal 2028. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2026.**

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: General fund expenditures increase by approximately \$628,900 in FY 2028, increasing to \$2.8 million in FY 2031; future year increases reflect higher per capita funding amounts and population growth. Revenues are not affected. **This bill increases a mandated appropriation beginning in FY 2028.**

Local Effect: Although local library systems benefit from SLRC funding, local finances are not materially affected.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Bill Summary: The bill increases per capita State aid for SLRC beginning in fiscal 2028 by varying amounts (ranging from an additional 10 cents per capita in fiscal 2028 to an additional 57 cents per capita in fiscal 2032). **Exhibit 1** compares per capita State aid under current law and under the bill.

Current Law:

State Library Network

Since 1888, the State has provided funds to support public libraries throughout the State under what is now known as the State library network. The network consists of the Central Library of the Enoch Pratt Free Library System in Baltimore City, three regional resource centers, and metropolitan cooperative service programs. All these systems receive State funding for operating expenses.

The Central Library of the Enoch Pratt Free Library operates as the designated SLRC. The funding level for SLRC is set at \$2.07 per resident. The fiscal 2027 State budget as introduced includes \$13.0 million in funding for SLRC.

Maryland State Library for the Blind and Print Disabled

The Maryland State Library for the Blind and Print Disabled (LBPB) provides comprehensive library services to eligible blind and physically disabled residents of Maryland, which includes individuals who are legally blind, visually or physically limited, or reading disabled. The library is part of the national network of the National Library Services for the Blind and Print Disabled through the Library of Congress. The National Library Services selects and produces recordings of full-length books and magazines for a network of libraries providing alternative format materials. LBPB supplements the National Library Service collection with large print books, descriptive videos, children's braille books, and tactile materials such as maps, atlases, and art books. Books are lent on a wide range of subjects in braille, audio, and large type. The service is free, statewide, and can be provided to individuals via the U.S. mail.

LBPB must receive an amount equivalent to at least 25% of the general fund appropriation received by SLRC under the required per capita funding amount. Based on the current budgeted amount for SLRC, the minimum State funding level for LBPB totals approximately \$3.2 million. However, the fiscal 2027 State budget as introduced includes \$3.5 million in funding for LBPB (\$3.1 million in general funds and \$378,536 in federal funds), which exceeds the minimum statutory required amount.

State Expenditures: As shown in **Exhibit 2**, State formula aid for SLRC increases by \$628,856 in fiscal 2028 and, based upon current projections for population growth, by \$2.8 million in fiscal 2031. Fiscal year 2032 is the final year of the statutory phase-in of the State formula aid for SLRC under the bill; expenditures thereafter reflect the fully phased-in funding level, subject to population changes.

Since the current State funding level for LBPB exceeds the minimum statutory required amount, the enhanced funding for SLRC is not projected to impact the level of State funding provided to LBPB. To the extent federal funding is reduced or unavailable in future years, additional general funds may be necessary to meet the funding requirement for LBPB.
