Senate Bill 534 (Frederick County Senators)  
Education, Energy, and the Environment

**Frederick Community College - Board of Trustees - Meeting and Training Requirements**

---

This bill establishes a requirement that the Board of Community College Trustees for Frederick County include an opportunity for public comment at each meeting. The board must also make an audio or video recording of each meeting and make the recording available to the public on the board’s website without charge and, to the extent practicable, within two business days after the recording is made. Additionally, as part of ongoing training and at least every two years, board members must undergo training specific to board governance, structure, responsibilities, and roles. **The bill takes effect June 1, 2026.**

**Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. This bill is directed at Frederick Community College (FCC).

**Local Effect:** FCC expenditures may increase minimally to record and post board meetings online. FCC can provide the required training make a recording available to public within existing resources. Frederick County revenues and expenditures are not affected, as funding formulas are not affected. **This bill may impose a mandate on a unit of local government.**

**Small Business Effect:** None.

**Analysis**

**Current Law:** The Board of Community College Trustees for Frederick County consists of seven members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. Each member be a resident of Frederick County at the time of appointment. Members serve

five-year term and may not serve more than three consecutive five-year terms. Additionally, a member of the Frederick County Board of Education may not serve on the Board of Community College Trustees. Each member is entitled to \$500 a year for expenses.

State law generally establishes that community college boards have seven members serving staggered six-year terms, with several specified exceptions. Therefore, there are variations in the number and terms of board members. **Appendix 1** shows characteristics of the various boards. With one exception, the boards are appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Maryland Senate. For Chesapeake College, the board is appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Maryland House of Delegates.

**Local Fiscal Effect:** If FCC lacks sufficient recording infrastructure, including recording equipment, technology support, and online hosting, costs may increase. However, FCC may minimize expenses by using low-cost options, such as recording on an existing computer and posting to free or low-cost online video platforms.

Training can likely be handled using existing resources. Members of the board serve without compensation but may be entitled to reimbursement for certain authorized expenses. Any such reimbursement is assumed to be minimal and absorbable with existing resources.

<sup>7</sup> Two members from each county that supports Chesapeake College (Caroline, Dorchester, Kent, Queen Anne's, and Talbot).

<sup>8</sup> All seven members must be a resident of Frederick County.

<sup>9</sup> All members must be a resident of Washington County at the time of appointment and maintain residency in Washington County throughout their term of appointment.

<sup>10</sup> All members must be a resident of Harford County for the duration of their term.

<sup>11</sup> Of the nine members, at least eight must be residents of Howard County at the time of appointment and maintain residency in Howard County throughout the term of appointment.

<sup>12</sup> A local nominating committee must submit to the Governor the names of two to four candidates per vacancy, from which the Governor must appoint a new member.

<sup>13</sup> The student member must be a resident of the county.

<sup>14</sup> All members must be a resident of Prince George's County.

<sup>15</sup> Members must be a resident of the State. Each of the southern Maryland counties must be represented by at least three members who are residents of the county.
