Senate Bill 306

(Senator Hettleman, *et al.*)

Education, Energy, and the Environment

**Education - Board of Community College Trustees for Baltimore County -
Membership**

This bill reduces the Baltimore County Board of Community College Trustees by four members by eliminating five councilmanic district seats and adding one at-large seat. As a result, the bill aligns district-based trustee representation (reduced to one member per district under the bill) with the County Council's nine-district structure in effect for the 2026 election cycle. The bill also accommodates the smaller board by (1) specifying the trustees whose terms must expire or who must shift to a new district and (2) staggering the terms of newly appointed trustees. **The bill takes effect June 1, 2026.**

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill only affects the Community College of Baltimore County.

Local Effect: Minimal decrease in reimbursement expenditures for Board of Community College trustee members beginning FY 2027 as a result of the smaller board. Local revenues are not affected.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Board of Community College Trustees for Baltimore County consists of 15 members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. Of the members, 1 serves at large and 14 serve from the seven councilmanic districts in Baltimore County, 2 from each district.

State law generally establishes that community college boards have seven members serving staggered six-year terms, with several specified exceptions. Therefore, there are variations in the number and terms of board members. **Appendix 1** shows characteristics of the various boards. With one exception, the boards are appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Maryland Senate. For Chesapeake College, the board is appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Maryland House of Delegates.

Currently, the Baltimore County Council comprises seven members each elected from one of seven councilmanic districts. For the 2026 and 2030 councilmanic elections, the council adopted a [new map](#) that includes nine councilmanic districts.

⁹All members must be a resident of Washington County at the time of appointment and maintain residency in Washington County throughout their term of appointment.

¹⁰All members must be a resident of Harford County for the duration of their term.

¹¹Of the nine members, at least eight must be residents of Howard County at the time of appointment and maintain residency in Howard County throughout the term of appointment.

¹²A local nominating committee must submit to the Governor the names of two to four candidates per vacancy, from which the Governor must appoint a new member.

¹³The student member must be a resident of the county.

¹⁴All members must be a resident of Prince George's County.

¹⁵Members must be a resident of the State. Each of the southern Maryland counties must be represented by at least three members who are residents of the county.
