A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2016,**
3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011,**
4 **2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~One Billion,~~
6 ~~Two Million, Three Hundred Eighty Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,002,385,000)~~ Nine
7 Hundred and Ninety-Eight Million, Six Hundred and Eighty-Six Thousand Dollars
8 (\$998,686,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, construction,
9 demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment
10 purchases of the State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and
11 for grants to certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain development
12 and improvement purposes, subject to certain requirements that certain matching
13 funds be provided and expended by certain dates; providing generally for the
14 issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan; authorizing the creation of State Debt
15 in certain years to be used for certain purposes; imposing a certain tax on all
16 assessable property in the State; requiring that certain grantees convey certain
17 easements under certain circumstances to the Maryland Historical Trust; providing
18 that the proceeds of certain loans must be expended or encumbered by a certain date;
19 authorizing the Board of Public Works, under certain circumstances, to approve
20 certain appropriations, notwithstanding certain technical differences; authorizing
21 certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans
22 to be expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for certain
23 programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; providing that the
24 authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans be
25 reduced by certain amounts; requiring that certain projects be constructed at certain
26 locations; repealing certain requirements for certain appropriations; requiring the
27 Comptroller to make certain transfers, adjustments, and reconciliations; repealing
28 certain Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan Preauthorization acts; specifying

- 33 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
34 That:
- 35 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
36 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
37 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2016 in the total principal amount of ~~\$1,002,385,000~~

1 ~~\$998,686,000~~. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State
2 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and
3 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 and 8–131.2 of the
4 State Finance and Procurement Article.

5 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a
6 single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

7 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and
8 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the
9 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on
10 the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for

(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan Preauthorization Act of 2019 in total principal amount of \$10,500,000. These loans shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 and 8–131.2 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.
