The general fund contingent reduction was modified to \$250,000 to reflect this action.	Reject.	Modify – The fiscal 2021 mandate was reduced to \$500,000, but the out-year inflationary increase is maintained.

PSA	123-DLS add'l	11-12	Extend the sunset of the \$40 Land Records surcharge permanently, which would revert to \$20 under current law in fiscal 2021. This surcharge is used to support land records offices and the Judiciary's information technology budget.		Adopt.	Concur with First House.
