Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2023, and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022

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HOUSE BILL 201

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SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That:

3 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on 4 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland 5 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2023 in the total principal amount of \$1,206,639,000 6 \$1,216,639,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State 7 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and 8 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 and 8–131.2 of the 9 State Finance and Procurement Article.

10 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a 11 single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

12 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and 13 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the 14 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on 15 the books of the Comptroller and expended on approval by the Board of Public Works, for 16 the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:

14 (4) An annual tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in rate and 15 amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and when due and 16 until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years after the date of issue 17 of the bonds.

proceeds authorized under Section 1(3) Items ZA00 through ZB02 of this Act, the grantee shall grant and convey to the Maryland Historical Trust a historic preservation easement on the property where the capital project assisted by the bond proceeds is located if the Director of the Trust determines that the capital project impacts real property that is individually listed in, or eligible for individual listing in, the Maryland Register of Historic Properties, unless the Director of the Trust also determines that the real property:

7 (i) Is a type that is already adequately represented among the 8 Trust's existing easement properties;

9 (ii) Is already subject to adequate protections of historic preservation 10 law or instrument; or

11 (iii) Has conditions peculiar to it that make requiring an easement 12 impractical.

13 (b) If the grantee holds a lease on the property, the Trust may accept an 14 easement on the leasehold interest.

15 (c) The easement must be in form, substance, and duration acceptable to 16 the Director of the Trust.

17 (d) (i) A recipient may administratively appeal to the Maryland 18 Historical Trust Board of Trustees a determination made by the Director of the Trust under 19 subparagraph (a) of this paragraph.

20 (ii) The decision made by the Maryland Historical Trust Board of 21 Trustees on an appeal is final and is not subject to further administrative appeal or judicial 22 review.

(7) The proceeds of the loan must be expended or encumbered by the Board of Public Works for the purposes provided in this Act no later than June 1, 2030.
