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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2025,**  
3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014,**  
4 **2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~One Billion,~~  
6 ~~Eight Hundred and Fourteen Million, Eight Hundred and Twenty-Five Thousand~~  
7 ~~Dollars (\$1,814,825,000)~~ One Billion, Seven Hundred and Sixty-Three Million,  
8 Three Hundred and Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,763,325,000), the proceeds  
9 to be used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition, planning,  
10 renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of the State,  
11 for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain  
12 subdivisions and other organizations for certain development and improvement  
13 purposes, subject to certain requirements that certain matching funds be provided  
14 and expended by certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds  
15 evidencing the loan; imposing a certain tax on all assessable property in the State;  
16 requiring that certain grantees convey certain easements under certain  
17 circumstances to the Maryland Historical Trust; providing that the proceeds of  
18 certain loans must be expended or encumbered by a certain date; exempting certain  
19 school construction grants awarded to certain counties from the requirement of a  
20 local cost-share match; providing that certain funds may be used only for certain  
21 purposes; requiring funds to be credited to a certain fund for a certain purpose;  
22 authorizing the Board of Public Works, under certain circumstances, to approve  
23 certain appropriations, notwithstanding certain differences; requiring the  
24 Department of General Services to record certain correct information in certain grant  
25 agreements under certain circumstances, notwithstanding certain differences;  
26 authorizing certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and  
27 bond loans to be expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for  
28 certain programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; reducing prior  
29 authorizations of State Debt; requiring that certain projects be constructed at certain

7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
8 That:

9 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
10 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
11 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2025 in the total principal amount of ~~\$1,814,825,000~~  
12 \$1,763,325,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State  
13 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and  
14 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 and 8–131.2 of the  
15 State Finance and Procurement Article.

16 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a  
17 single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

18 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and  
19 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the  
20 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on  
21 the books of the Comptroller and expended on approval by the Board of Public Works, for  
22 the following public purposes, including any applicable architects’ and engineers’ fees:

 17 Construction. Further provided that grants made to nonpublic  
 18 schools shall be expended within 3 years of the date that  
 19 funding for the grants became available. Any funding for grants  
 20 that is unexpended following 3 years of having become  
 21 available shall be transferred to the Unreserved Statewide  
 22 Contingency Account for public school construction

 25 Systems. Provide funds to local school systems with enrollment

 29 Education Article and can be used for grants to local boards of  
 30 education for federal E–rate–eligible special construction such  
 31 as fiber and broadband infrastructure projects for

 33 Title 5, Subtitle 3 of the Education Article, a grant awarded by  
 34 the Interagency Commission on School Construction to a  
 35 county with the highest student enrollment count in the
