## **HOUSE BILL INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 20, 2020**

### **HB 1629 Delegate Clippinger**

#### **OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL – FIREARM CRIME – STUDY**

Requiring the Office of the Attorney General to study and identify certain information relating to certain firearm crimes committed in the State since August 1, 2015; requiring all State and local law enforcement agencies and other governmental units to provide the Office of the Attorney General with any and all information necessary to complete the study; requiring the Office of the Attorney General to report its findings and conclusions to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 1, 2020, and December 1, 2022; etc.

NATALIE M. LAPRADE MEDICAL CANNABIS COMMISSION –  
EDUCATION PROGRAMS AND RESEARCH PROJECTS – LICENSES

Authorizing the Natalie M. LaPrade Medical Cannabis Commission to issue medical cannabis education program licenses and medical cannabis research project licenses for certain purposes; requiring a certain applicant to submit certain information and a certain application fee to the Commission; requiring the Commission to grant a certain application under certain circumstances; requiring the Commission to deny a certain application under certain circumstances; etc.

INCOME TAX – SUBTRACTION MODIFICATION – RETIREMENT  
INCOME

Authorizing a subtraction modification under the Maryland income tax for certain retirement income attributable to certain out-of-state employment as a correctional officer, law enforcement officer, or fire, rescue, or emergency services personnel; and applying the Act to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2019.

CHILD SUPPORT – EXTRAORDINARY MEDICAL EXPENSES

Clarifying that the calculation of extraordinary medical expenses for the purposes of determining a parental child support obligation under the child support guidelines includes the cumulative contributions of both parents.
