HOUSE BILLS INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 20, 2023

HB 1267 Delegates Wilkins and Toles

PROMISE SCHOOLS – ESTABLISHMENT

Requiring the State Department of Education to designate 10 community schools that are identified as low-performing or in need of comprehensive support and improvement as promise schools each year; requiring a county board of education to perform a comprehensive analysis of key factors and causes that led to a school being low-performing or in need of comprehensive support and improvement; requiring the Governor to include \$2,000,000 in the annual budget bill to support technical assistance and support for promise schools; etc.

Preliminary analysis: local government mandate

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill.

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HB 1268 Delegate Howard**INCOME TAX – CREDIT FOR ELECTRIC AUTOCYCLES, BICYCLES, AND MOTORCYCLES**

Allowing a credit against the State income tax for the purchase price of certain electric autocycles, bicycles, or motorcycles purchased for personal use during the taxable year; providing the credit may not exceed the lesser of \$500 for each qualified vehicle or the State income tax for that taxable year; and applying the Act to all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2022.

HB 1269 Delegates Harris and Griffith**INCOME TAX – SUBTRACTION MODIFICATION – PUBLIC SAFETY VOLUNTEERS**

Increasing, from \$7,000 to \$10,000, the amount of a subtraction modification under the Maryland income tax for an individual who is a qualifying public safety volunteer for a taxable year beginning after December 31, 2023.

HB 1270 Dorchester County Delegation**DORCHESTER COUNTY – COUNTY APPLICANTS – POLYGRAPH EXAMINATIONS**

Exempting applicants for employment as a paramedic or an emergency medical technician provider with Dorchester County, as a 9–1–1 Center dispatcher at the Dorchester County 9–1–1 Center, or as a correctional officer of the Dorchester County Detention Center from the prohibition on employers requiring or demanding that an individual submit to or take a polygraph examination as a condition of prospective employment.
