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# **SENATE BILLS INTRODUCED February 15, 2023**

# **SB 895** Senators Ready and Klausmeier

PHARMACY BENEFITS ADMINISTRATION – MARYLAND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AND PHARMACY BENEFITS MANAGERS

Altering the reimbursement levels for drug products that the Maryland Medical Assistance Program is required to establish and that pharmacy benefits managers that contract with a pharmacy on behalf of a managed care organization are required to reimburse the pharmacy; and altering the definition of "purchaser" for purposes of certain provisions of law regulating pharmacy benefits managers to include certain insurers, nonprofit health services plans, and health maintenance organizations.

# **SB 896** Senators Ready and Klausmeier

## PHARMACY BENEFITS MANAGERS - PROHIBITED ACTIONS

Prohibiting a pharmacy benefits manager from taking certain actions related to pricing, the participation of a pharmacy or pharmacist in a policy or contract with the pharmacy benefits manager, fees, and the use of a mail order pharmacy by beneficiaries; providing that certain provisions of the Act apply to pharmacy benefits managers that contract with managed care organizations in the same manner as they apply to pharmacy benefits managers that contract with carriers; etc.

## SB 897 Carroll County Senators

#### CARROLL COUNTY - CONTRACTS AND PURCHASING

Increasing from \$25,000 to \$50,000 the cost of a public work or improvement or the purchase price of supplies or equipment for which the County Commissioners of Carroll County may enter into a contract; and requiring that when the cost of a public work or improvement or the purchase price of supplies or equipment in Carroll County exceeds \$50,000 under certain conditions, the Chief of the Bureau of Purchasing for the County Commissioners shall advertise for bids for at least 1 week in a media accessible to the general public. EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2023

#### **SB 898** Senators Ready and Klausmeier

PHARMACY BENEFITS MANAGERS – DEFINITIONS OF CARRIER, ERISA, AND PURCHASER

Repealing the definitions of "carrier" and "ERISA" and altering the definition of "purchaser" for the purpose of applying certain provisions of State insurance law governing pharmacy benefits managers to certain persons that provide prescription drug coverage or benefits in the State through plans or programs subject to ERISA; and repealing a certain provision that restricts applicability of certain provisions of law to pharmacy benefits managers that provide pharmacy benefits management services on behalf of a carrier.

## CRIMINAL LAW - CHILD PORNOGRAPHY - PROHIBITIONS

Prohibiting an individual from intentionally retaining 100 or more visual representations of child pornography or child pornography that depicts an individual who is or is indistinguishable from a minor under the age of 5 years.

# MARYLAND CLEAN ENERGY CENTER – CLIMATE TECHNOLOGY FOUNDER'S FUND – ESTABLISHMENT

Establishing the Climate Technology Founder's Fund in the Maryland Clean Energy Center to provide early–stage funding for start–up companies focused on qualified projects in climate technologies; requiring the Center to report to the Governor and the General Assembly by October 1, each year, on the use of the Fund and outcomes of investments made from the Fund; and requiring the Governor to include in the annual budget bill for fiscal year 2025, \$500,000 for the Fund.

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill.

# MARYLAND MATERNITY CARE ACCESS PROGRAM, FUND, AND INCOME TAX CHECKOFF – ESTABLISHMENT

Establishing the Maryland Maternity Care Access Program in the Maryland Department of Health to develop and sustain pregnancy support centers in the State; establishing the Maryland Maternity Care Access Program Fund; requiring the Governor in fiscal year 2025 and each fiscal year thereafter to include \$3,000,000 in the annual budget bill for the Program; requiring a report on the uses of the Fund by October 1 each year beginning in 2024; and establishing an income tax checkoff system for voluntary contributions to the Fund.

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill.

LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT – MARYLAND HEALTHY WORKING FAMILIES ACT – SEASONAL TEMPORARY WORKERS

Increasing, from 106 to 120 days, the period during which an employer is not required to allow an employee to use earned sick and safe leave; altering the circumstances under which an employer is required to reinstate certain unused sick and safe leave; and altering the circumstances under which an employer is authorized to require an employee who uses earned sick and safe leave to provide certain verification.

LAND USE – EXPEDITED DEVELOPMENT REVIEW PROCESSES FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING – APPLICATION TO RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATIONS

Requiring, on or after July 1, 2024, a county that uses an expedited development review process for proposed affordable housing developments to consider certain applications from bona fide religious organizations under the expedited development review process; and authorizing a county to opt out of the provisions of the Act by adopting a certain local law on or before June 30, 2024.

FORECLOSURE PROCEEDINGS – RESIDENTIAL MORTGAGORS AND GRANTORS – ACCESS TO COUNSEL

Requiring that individuals have access to legal representation in certain foreclosure proceedings; establishing the Access to Counsel in Foreclosure Proceedings Program and Special Fund to provide funding to fully implement access to legal representation in foreclosure proceedings in the State; requiring the Maryland Legal Services Corporation to provide access to legal representation under the Program; requiring the Comptroller to collect a fee on residential property sales to be paid to the Fund; etc.

ELECTRIC COMPANIES, GAS COMPANIES, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT – ENERGY EFFICIENCY AND CONSERVATION PLANS

Requiring each electric company and gas company and the Department of Housing and Community Development to procure or provide for its customers or certain individuals, beginning September 1, 2023, and every 3 years thereafter, certain energy efficiency, conservation, and greenhouse gas emissions reduction programs and services to encourage and promote the efficient use and conservation of energy in support of certain greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals and targets; etc.

### **SB 906** Senator Rosapepe

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT – INDUSTRY 4.0 TECHNOLOGY GRANT PROGRAM

Establishing the Industry 4.0 Technology Grant Program in the Department of Commerce to provide grants to certain small and medium—sized manufacturing enterprises to assist those manufacturers with implementing new Industry 4.0 technology or related infrastructure for certain purposes; establishing the Industry 4.0 Technology Grant Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; and requiring the Governor to include in the annual budget bill an appropriation of \$10,000,000 to the Fund for each of fiscal years 2024 through 2028.

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill.

# MARYLAND FILM OFFICE – ENTERTAINMENT AND FILM FUNDING GRANT PROGRAM – ESTABLISHMENT

Establishing the Entertainment and Film Funding Grant Program within the Maryland Film Office to provide grants to qualifying production entities to assist with the production costs of entertainment and film projects in the State; prohibiting any grant awarded under the Program from exceeding \$200,000 for one project; and requiring the Governor to include an appropriation in the annual budget bill of \$5,000,000 to the Office for the Program in fiscal year 2025 and each fiscal year thereafter.

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill.

STATE PROCUREMENT – PREFERENCES – HISTORICALLY UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESS ZONE BUSINESSES

Requiring a unit to structure procurement procedures to try to achieve or exceed a certain overall percentage goal of the unit's total dollar value of procurement contracts to be made with historically underutilized business zone businesses; providing for the determination of expected historically underutilized business zone business participation for individual solicitations; including certain historically underutilized business zone businesses in the Small Business Reserve Program; etc.

Altering the definition of "public safety officer" to include certain public safety officers employed full time by a State public safety agency for purposes of a certain property tax credit against the county or municipal corporation property tax imposed on the dwelling of a public safety officer.

Altering the definition of a "therapy horse" under the Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program.

NATURAL RESOURCES – FISHING LICENSES AND STAMPS – EXEMPTIONS

Authorizing the Department of Natural Resources to issue an annual fishing license and stamp exemption to governmental entities and nonprofit organizations to provide fishing clinics and instructional opportunities to certain individuals; and altering certain reporting requirements for governmental entities and nonprofit organizations that are issued certain fishing license and stamp exemptions.

EDUCATION – LOW–DENSITY CALCULATION – MANDATED FUNDING

Requiring, for each of fiscal years 2025 through 2027, the Governor to include in the annual budget bill an appropriation in an amount equal to the low–density calculation for counties that have a population density amount of less than 100 and a full–time equivalent student enrollment of fewer than 2,000 students.

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill.

PUBLICLY FUNDED FULL-DAY PREKINDERGARTEN PROGRAM – TIER I CHILD – ALTERATION OF DEFINITION

Altering the definition of a "Tier I child" who may be enrolled beginning in the 2022–2023 school year to a full–day prekindergarten program, to include children with a disability, children who are homeless youths, and children who are from homes in which English is not the primary spoken language.

#### HOSPITALS – OVERDOSES – TESTING FOR FENTANYL

Requiring the emergency department of a hospital to conduct a rapid urine drug test for fentanyl in patients with a known or suspected drug overdose if a toxicology report is required by a treating health care provider.

# RAILROAD COMPANY – MOVEMENT OF FREIGHT – REQUIRED CREW

Prohibiting a train or light engine used in the movement of freight in the same rail corridor as a high–speed passenger or commuter train from being operated in the State unless it has at least two crew members; and establishing a penalty for a first offense of a \$500 fine and for subsequent offenses within a 3–year period, a fine of \$1,000 for each offense.

Prohibiting the use, manufacture, sale, offering for sale, or distribution of ethylene oxide in the State; and providing a civil penalty not to exceed \$1,000 for a first violation of the Act and up to \$5,000 for a second or subsequent violation.

# VEHICLE LAWS – LIGHTING – PRIVATELY OWNED VEHICLES OF VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY MEMBERS

Authorizing certain members of a volunteer fire company to equip their privately owned vehicles with red and white lights or signal devices.

HIGHER EDUCATION – COMMUNITY COLLEGE FACILITIES RENEWAL GRANT PROGRAM – ALTERATIONS

Increasing the number of grants, from 8 to 16, that the Maryland Higher Education Commission may make under the Community College Facilities Renewal Grant Program in each fiscal year; repealing certain limitations on the number and amount of grants a community college may receive under the Program; and altering the required appropriation to the Program beginning in fiscal year 2024.

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill.

REAL PROPERTY – EXPEDITED WRONGFUL DETAINER PROCEEDINGS – PROPERTY FOR SALE OR LEASE

Requiring certain expedited proceedings in a wrongful detainer action if the property that is the subject of the action is, at the time of the complaint, advertised or listed for sale or lease by the complainant and requiring that notice of a hearing or appeal be served in person or, under certain circumstances, posted conspicuously on the property; etc.

#### STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT – RETENTION PROCEEDS

Requiring that undisputed retention proceeds retained by a unit or a certain contractor under a State procurement contract be paid within 90 days after the date of substantial completion.
