Chairman and members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in support of SB 91 – Election Law – Individuals Released from Correctional Facilities – Voter Registration. My name is Donna S. Edwards and I am the President of the Maryland State and District of Columbia AFL-CIO. On behalf of the 340,000 union members, I offer the following comments.

Maryland enfranchised ex-felons by passing HB 980 – Election Law – Voting Rights – Ex-Felons, in 2016, allowing all ex-felons the opportunity to register and vote in our elections.

With SB 91 we have the opportunity to pro-actively offer ex-offenders a voter registration form and instruct them that, upon their release from a correctional facility after serving their time, they have the right to vote and must register to do so. This is an important step in re-acclimating to society, and it's a communication from the State to ex-offenders that they are citizens, and can enjoy all of the rights and responsibilities that citizenship confers.

For these reasons, we urge a favorable report on SB 91
