Senate Bill 457 Local Governments - Resilience Authorities - Authorization

The Chesapeake Bay Foundation SUPPORTS SB 457 as it provides Maryland communities the flexibility to address their unique needs to mitigate the effects of climate change. This bill enables counties and municipalities to create "resilience authorities" that can issue bonds as the funding mechanisms for critical resiliency projects.

The threats posed by sea level rise and climate change create planning, infrastructure, and emergency management needs. These increased demands may strain county and municipal budgets. At the same time, existing State funding for environmental programs, some of which may help mitigate the effects of severe weather patterns and flooding, is limited, and the intended water quality focus of that funding must maintained for the State to reach the environmental preservation aims of the Chesapeake Bay Blueprint.

This bill enables counties and municipalities to create "resilience authorities" that can issue bonds for the primary purpose of funding critical resiliency projects. The flexibility to use resilience authority bonding mechanisms to acquire property for resilience infrastructure, and construct, improve, and maintain existing resilience infrastructure supports the ability of counties and municipalities in addressing the raft of issues brought on by sea level rise and climate change.
