High Performance and Green Buildings - Community Colleges and Public Schools - Repeal of Requirements and Guidelines

The Chesapeake Bay Foundation SUPPORTS SB 655 as a correction of the unintended walk back on high-performance green building standards for Maryland's schools and community colleges. This bill repeals new guidelines that weakened requirements for green building and energy efficiency and create a waiver from requirements.

Green building and energy efficiency in buildings help confront climate change. The reduction of climate-impacting greenhouse gases is critical to achieving Bay clean-up goals.

The Chesapeake Bay Foundation supports legislation to reduce the greenhouse gas emissions of the State's public schools and community colleges. As described in *Towards a zero-emission, efficient, and resilient buildings and construction sector*, "Multiple opportunities exist to mitigate greenhouse gas emissions in the buildings and construction sector. The energy and emissions savings potential in buildings remains largely untapped due to continued use of less efficient technologies, alongside lack of effective policies and weak investments in sustainable buildings and construction in many countries." (United Nations' Environment 2017 Global Status Report).

This bill reinstates green building and high-performance energy standards as requirements for public school construction in Maryland. These requirements recommended by the Maryland Green Building Council in the High Performing Green Building Program were first instituted in 2008.
