Dear Chair Pinsky, Vice Chair Kagan and Members:

I am asking for your support of Senate Bill SB 432. This proposal was included in the Charles County Commissioners 2020 Legislative Package and would allow Charles County to join 10 other Maryland counties and opt-in to legislation allowing certain agritourism buildings exemptions from selected building codes.

SB 432 will benefit Charles County with increased revenue and tax base by enhancing the marketability of our area as a tourist destination and increase farm viability. It will provide additional educational and entertainment opportunities for our community and assists landowners in making a living from their land.

The exemption poses no public safety risk, as the buildings still need to follow building codes such as adhering to structural integrity standards and entrance and exit requirements. For this reason, our county's EMS and Fire Department expressed verbal and written support. It was unanimously approved by our County Commissioners and supported by our Planning & Growth Management and Economic Development Division.
