Ice Hollow Farms has been challenged, as with other Maryland farmers, by the lack of processing facilities. The market will not grow in Maryland without these specialized agricultural facilities. Whereas CBD production from processed flower is the product of choice at the time, expansion into the food, fiber, building materials and other markets will not occur without advocacy by agricultural agencies.
