Re: HB 589 Solid Waste Management - Organics Recycling and Waste Diversion - Food Residuals

The Maryland Recycling Network promotes sustainable reduction, reuse and recycling (the 3 "R's") of materials otherwise destined for disposal and the purchase of products made with recycled material content. We achieve these goals through education programs, advocacy activities to affect public policy, technical assistance efforts, and the development of markets to purchase recycled materials and manufacture products with recycled content.

We are writing to share our general support for the spirit of HB 589 Solid Waste Management - Organics Recycling and Waste Diversion - Food Residuals, with the anticipation that greater clarity will be provided for 9–1724.1.(A) (2) (I) HAS THE CAPACITY TO ACCEPT AND PROCESS THE FOOD RESIDUALS; AND (II) IS WILLING TO ACCEPT THE FOOD RESIDUALS FOR RECYCLING. Specifically, we understand that the Maryland Department of the Environment will specify guidance regarding standards for capacity/quality of processing facility and minimum volume requirements for generators. We also understand there will be an amendment proposed that price must be competitive with disposal cost or generator will be allowed to apply for a waiver.
